

Poco, Poco or A Broken Leg with A Spanish Twist

"Poco, poco". These are words that will stay with me for a long time yet. They first came to my ears as gentle words of encouragement as I gingerly took my first steps in a hospital room in Northern Spain. The operation, I was told, had gone well and all I had to do now was to rest.

Little had I known, as Steve and I had set off for our walking holiday the Sunday before, that three days later we would be having very strange yet amusing conversations in a hospital room in Torrelavega with a delightful Spanish family. My Spanish at best is non existent but when circumstances demand some sort of communication it is surprising the extent to which one can use actions, bits of other languages and illustrations to get by.

Communication might well have been a problem if it had not been for our excellent guide who was leading us in the foothills of the Picos de Europa. This wonderful man, Andy, helped us through the aftermath of the accident, talking to the ambulance medics and eventually with the hospital staff.

It was while we were talking to the doctors in A & E that I was asked to produce my E111. Fortunately I always carry this in my purse and so having once seen this small but very valuable card the staff were able to admit me immediately. If I had left it in my hotel room it would have meant a three hour journey at best before any type of treatment could have been given.

By the end of the day my leg was in a temporary plaster. I was in a twin ensuite room and Steve had returned to the hotel with Andy. I was left to reflect on all that had happened since 9.30 that morning.

After taking a cable car to the highest point we had begun a long steady descent back to Espinama our base for the week. The scenery had been quite magical. At the top severe rock faces in all the shades of grey you can imagine. Underfoot somewhat rocky with loose stones but nothing hazardous. As we descended the terrain changed and as more and more green crept into the landscape we found that talking with our companions became easier.

It was a beautiful day – neither hot nor cold. Good walking weather.

I suppose I must have been talking too much and not concentrating as much as I should. The result was that from being upright with two good legs I was on the ground , twisted with one mangled leg. From that moment on I witnessed the extent to which people will help and care for others when in need.

With no mobile connection due to the location and a further two hours walking the situation could have been difficult. I think we were all completely and utterly amazed when an old Landrover driven by a local workman appeared coming towards us on the track. Now I am sure many of you will had had the experience of travelling in old landrovers so you will appreciate when I say they are not the most comfy of vehicles. Nevertheless despite excruciating pain as the bones of my leg slopped from side to side, I was so grateful to this 'Senor' for being there and 'carrying' me down the mountain to the village. I don't know what he was doing there or why he was there. I just hope that he knows how very, very grateful I am to him.

"Poco, poco", Senor Alverez is telling me to go slowly, slowly, little by little. He is demonstrating how to use crutches which amuses Senora immensely. She indicates to me that he really has no idea and is even "loco, loco". I understand her to say that he should let me rest a while. Of course he does as he is told and the couple once more become silent.


The broken leg is now on the mend due to some creative metalwork and screws resembling the old Meccano that my brother and I played with as children.

I am hopeful by Christmas I shall be no longer be "poco, poco and definitely not loco, loco" but be able to enjoy all the parties and festivities.

Our holiday was cut short and there has been some pain and some difficult moments. All these have passed. We have also been touched by friendship, kindness and good humour. We have briefly brushed alongside and into the lives of others we would never have met. All of this will not pass but will remain with us.

Remember the E111? Never forget it. Always have it with you.

ALL SAINTS' CHURCH ENFORD

Not a day goes by without something on our TVs about taking care of our planet. If there is one thing that has really done well in the Vicarage garden in the last two years it is the planting of a hedge around the garden to cover our wooden fence.

I did some exploring and found that hedges are very old indeed going back to before 1066 – the Norman Conquest, and some over 150 years old.

In the early days they acted as boundaries between one estate and another, each landowner dug a ditch along the edge of his property, piled the soil in a bank and planted hawthorns along it. Other hedges are the remnants of woodlands or even Royal Forests.

Other hedges date from Tudor Times when farmers began to enclose the old open fields and changed them into proper compact farms. After all, the point of a hedge was to keep animals in one field grazing and crops in another – hedges stopped the two getting mixed up.

Hedges, especially in the Fens, serve as great protection against soil erosion. They are also great refuges for many species of wild animals and plants serving as ideal shelter for mother nature. In many parts of the country hedges are being put back and in others being uprooted for farmers to have bigger fields to suit their bigger machinery.

Maybe by trying to achieve one objective we maybe creating fresh problems at the same time.

How much we need to be more protective of all forms of life.






