

From the Team Rector Rev. Mark Zammit



'For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.' (Isaiah 9:6)

As we contemplate the Christmas season and the start of a New Year we are all aware of the uncertainties which we face, especially in terms of our finances, jobs and economic prospects. We have to face the big questions of life: what shall I do?; who can help me?; who cares for me? and what do I say?

The familiar words of the prophet Isaiah were also given by God in a time of political and economic uncertainty. The Assyrians had just conquered the northern kingdom of Israel, fulfilling Isaiah's warnings to the people, who had turned their back on God and his ways. However, Isaiah also brings a word of hope, 'The people walking in darkness have seen a great light'. For Isaiah, it felt as if the future had already arrived! However, after 700 years the promised child was fulfilled in the birth of Jesus. For us, facing a New Year, he continues to be an answer to both our needs and questions:

Prince of Peace: he has secured peace by his cross and resurrection, and so we can find in him true acceptance, forgiveness and peace for our lives, relationships and future.

Therefore at the start of 2012, may 'our joy be increased,' as for the people in Isaiah's day. For only Jesus can truly turn our sorrow into joy and save us from the vicious spiral of sin and death. Whatever the mess and mistakes we have made over the past year, he can deal with them. With him both our present and future are secure. This is no pipe-dream, for 'the zeal of the Lord Almighty will accomplish this.'

A STORY TO TELL BEFORE CHRISTMAS.

I would like to start this off, by using a phrase that the well-known Max Bygraves used to say, "I Want To Tell You A Story".

In the early summer of 2005 my wife and I were returning from the Swan Inn after having lunch and walking through Enford Church Yard when we noticed a sedate lady standing by a bench seat.. The lady 'who was called Ms Jane Sansom was endeavouring to replace a brass dedication plate with a new stainless steel plate by some type of fixings. The bench had been placed in the Church Yard by Jane in dedication to Squadron Leader Ewen Gillies DFC and Bar 1920-2003 who had passed away on the 12th July 2003 aged 82 and was laid to rest at his homeland in the Scottish Highlands.

Ewan was born in Cromarty on 20th August 1920. He had volunteered for the RAF at 19, became a bomber pilot and then captained Beaufort torpedo bombers. He was one of the most decorated bomber pilots in WW2 being awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross in April 1943 with the Bar being added in 1945. He had carried out 100 sorties at Mast Height on enemy shipping in the Mediterranean and the Northern European Waters. It must be remembered that this young man like many others at the time, with great courage, faced the most terrible odds. Torpedo Bombers suffered the highest casualty rates of any RAF crews in WW2. They had to fly at low level over the sea in the face of enemy fire to reach their target. Ewen and crew had only a 3% chance of surviving the 100 anti-shipping sorties he flew during the war.

At our chance meeting with Jane, I asked her if she would allow me to change and fix the new stainless steel dedication plate as it had to be screwed/fixed to the bench to make it safe. From then on our relationship with Jane has been on-going as I have been looking after Ewen's seat year on year..

Jane and Ewen are past residents of Enford, residing within the late Dominic and Sarah Campbells estate. Jane was also a WRAF Squadron Leader and was stationed at RAF Upavon.

In September 2011 Jane and her god daughter, also named Jane, visited the churchyard to lay a single rose on Ewen's bench and then afterwards went to the Swan Inn. On their return to London they realised that between leaving the bench, the Swan Inn and the journey back to London Jane had "lost" her sapphire and diamond ring that Ewen had given her.

After speaking with Jane, I searched around Ewen's seat on the off chance that the ring may still be there but with no result. Later, a chance conversation in the Swan with my neighbour David Smith about Jane and the lost ring, rang a bell with him. He told me that on the day the lady was in the Swan, a Bruce McMillan had been in the Swan for a meal and found a ring outside but no-one in the Swan seemed to have lost it. Phone calls were made between Jane, Bruce and me regarding the lost ring and the upshot was that the ring had been found.

In October 2011 at 1pm $\,$ Jane and her god daughter , Bruce McMillan, Dave Smith, my wife Pauline and me met. At last Jane was reunited with Ewen's ring.

We all thank Jane for the lunch and drinks and we send our very best wishes to her on the recovery of her precious Ewen's ring.

- 1. Awards will be considered every 6 months in March and September
- 2. Awards will be made for individual projects and are not designed to allow awardees to become reliant on the award on an annual/regular basis
- 3. Awards will be made to causes that benefit the community and not specific individuals
- 4. No awards will be made for greater than £1000
- 5. For any award to be granted there must be agreement by at least 75% of the funding committee

Tales of a Morris Cowley Part Three

Last month I wrote of a few of my early adventures in my most favourite car, a Yellow 1928 Morris Cowley. On yet another of our many trips from Portsmouth to London and back in the night with yet another load of friends, we ran out of petrol at Milford, just South of Godalming: Luckily, or so we thought, right beside a petrol station. It was of course closed at 3:00 am. Being fairly full of liquid good cheer we had several bright ideas: one of us used to run a competition with himself to see how many ladies' loos he could use. He was no use to us: He later became an Admiral! However another enterprising friend, whose father, another Admiral, had won the VC at Zeebrugge, disappeared. We searched high and low and eventually found him trying to siphon petrol out of an electric milk truck! We finally went to sleep in the car till morning.

At the end of our courses at Portsmouth, I was appointed, in early 1954, to a Minehunter in Scotland at the Naval Base at Port Edgar, right under the Forth Railway Bridge. The car did sterling service in Scotland: Amongst other achievements were putting off the less adventurous girl-friends and encouraging others. A few months after I arrived, a major catastrophe occurred late one night. My ship was small and only had a two or three people on board at night, including me. It was berthed down a long jetty and the car kept was at the top, some hundred yards away. I was woken by a dockyard policeman during the early hours, who said, "Your car is on fire, you'd better come". I did, and arrived at the top of the jetty to see a smoking wreck covered in foam supplied by an enthusiastic Edinburgh Fire Brigade. The whole of the back behind the windscreen appeared to be gone apart from the metal body. The policeman announced to all and sundry, 'that will never go again'. Out of sheer cussedness, I walked round to the front and wound the starting handle. It started with a gentle rumble and then ticked over nicely. In these cars, the petrol tank was under the bonnet and there was a firewall of sorts between the front and the back. From that moment. I knew I had to restore it!

What we deduced had happened was that a drunken sailor, wandering back to his ship, had stopped, thinking that the car was a good place to rest and smoke a fag. Unfortunately I used to carry a four gallon jerry-can full of petrol in the back. He must have left his cigarette smouldering when he staggered on home. This set light to the seat which then cooked off the jerry-can. Rumour had it that the explosion was seen and heard in Edinburgh, some seven miles away! Although we were pretty certain who the culprit was, we could never prove it.

Thus began not only a long restoration programme on a minimal budget, but also some months of driving with no windows, roof or seats! The lack of windows and roof was bearable, if a little cold, but the seats were a problem. To start with I used two old petrol cans, unanchored. As driver, the only way to keep your can partially still was to hang on the steering wheel. The passenger, unless she was very alert, had more of a problem, and at least one promising relationship ended with her sliding forward into the dashboard on braking. A pity, because her father owned lumber camps and paper mills all over the world!

PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY - OUTSTANDING MATTERS

ENFORD FOOTPATH No 19

On 26 June 2010, I reported to Wilts Council, via CLARENCE, that the footplate of the metal bridge crossing the River Avon on the Coombe/Fifield footpath, had a number of rust holes which required attention. Also, one of the lower guard rails had broken due to rust at two points. Defect number 461015 was allocated and I was informed that the report had been forwarded to the Highways Area Office based in Marlborough. As no action was taken, I submitted, during February and March 2011, two requests for updates relative to this situation. Both were unanswered.

During the Easter period 2011, some 'thoughtful person(s)' decided it was necessary to remove the piece of broken guard rail, break it into two pieces and dispose of it into the river. On 18 Aug 2011, this situation was raised as an ISSUE with Tidworth Area Board under reference 1844. The latest information received is dated 21 September 2011 and states:- 'Site visit carried out. Officer confirms that the bridge concerned is on the list for replacement and consents have been applied for.'

ENFORD FOOTPATH No 25

This Foot Path runs in a westerly direction from the junction of the A345 and Enford Hill, and climbs steeply through a small wooded area for a distance of approximately 30yds. This section is stepped, but due to seriously decaying timbers forming these steps, the path is covered with loose soil which turns to mud after only a short period of rain, thus making it exceedingly slippery. A metal hand rail is in situ for the upper and lower sections of this climb, but a bracket on the lower section of this rail has been broken thus making it unstable.

This matter was reported via CLARENCE on 14 February 2011, but they failed to respond. CLARENCE also failed to respond to a request for an update submitted on 2 March 2011. For information, this Footpath is part of the designated route for the Pewsey Avon Trail, and The Great Stones Way Walk. (www.greatstonesway.org.uk) On 1 August 2011, I and four colleagues walked down this slope (East-West), and despite being warned of the problem, one person slipped, fell onto his back, and slid for 6-8ft before reaching the bottom. Fortunately he was uninjured. The problems of this path have been reported on previous occasions, but as no remedial action has been taken, this too was reported as an ISSUE to Tidworth Area Board on 18 August 2011, reference number 1842.

The latest information on this matter is also dated 21 September 2011:- 'Site visit carried out. Work on footpath is now programmed and priority as been raised.

ENFORD FOOT PATH NO 31

This PROW links East and West Chisenbury. On 5 March 2011, a West Chisenbury resident reported some damage to the tarmacadam surface in the form of cracks and potholes. A request was submitted to Wiltshire Council via CLARENCE, for the path to be checked. No response was forthcoming from Wiltshire Council, therefore this was also reported as an ISSUE to Tidworth Area Board on 18 August 2011, reference no 1841. The latest information available for this matter is also dated 21 September 2011;-'Site visit carried out. Work to be programmed'.

I will continue to monitor these ISSUES.

SALISBURY PLAIN TRAINING AREA NEWS SHEET December 2011

Defence Infrastructure Organisation

STOP PRESS: MOD, Wiltshire Council and Landmarc staff plus Tread Lightly volunteers have now inserted over 200 signs and effectively completed Larkhill Artillery Range, the area between Chitterne, Shrewton and Tilshead plus the area south of the B 390 (Shrewton to Chitterne Road).



TRAINING ON SPTA

December will see less training on the Plain and except for movement to and from SPTA convoys will be restricted to the training area and tank crossings

1 and 2 December plus 8 and 9 December sees Royal School of Artillery courses live firing including AS90 155mm self propelled guns. While 1 Mechanised Brigade continues their communications and logistic exercise across the Plain until 16 December, the Defence Logistics School will run combat logistic patrols of up to 80 heavy wheeled vehicles.

From 5 – 8 December and 12 – 15 December the Land Warfare Centre will mount two large armoured exercises FOXES THRUST and BLACK ADDER with reconnaissance and armoured infantry deploying across most of SPTA.

On 13 and 14 December 12 Mechanised Brigade will mount a live fire weapons effect exercise on Imber Ranges using the full range of weapons deployed in Afghanistan. From 17 December military activity reduces to a low level.

Note. Vehicle movement may cause delays at tank crossings and drivers are advised to take care when approaching crossings as mud clearance parties and mechanical sweepers will be at work.

FIRING NOISE

Live Firing. Firing is closely managed to ensure that legal noise limits are not exceeded and disturbance is minimised. Although some may find the noise intrusive, it is well below legal limits.

Bulford Ranges. Rights of Way (PROW) through Bulford Ranges are closed when red flags are flying. No firing is planned for 10th, 11th, 17th December to 8th January 2012 inclusive

Larkhill Ranges. Rights of Way (PROW through Larkhill Ranges are closed when red flags are flying. No firing is planned for 3rd, 4th, 11th, 15th December to 8th January inclusive

Note. In the event of range fires access may be denied to some areas due to the risk of unexploded ordnance "cooking off".

Imber. Difficult terrain and unexploded military debris make it hazardous to leave the marked routes. The public are excluded from Imber Ranges at all times, even if flags are not flying. The only exception being when the roads through Imber are opened to allow the public to reduce journey times across Imber Ranges.


