Save Money On Your Heating Oil Bills!

We have recently joined the Community First (CF) Bulk Oil Buying Scheme which is a scheme that has been set up to help purchasers of central heating oil to make savings by buying in bulk. CF is a local charity that works to support community based action across Wiltshire.

It cost us £20 a year to join the scheme. We have just received our first delivery of 800 litres. The CF Oil negotiated price for the delivery was 54.9 pence per litre (ppl), the average price quoted to CF Oil at that time was 60.5ppl and the highest 70ppl! Based on the average quoted price we have saved £44.80 so even after the membership cost we have already saved money.

In summary householders pay an annual fee of £20 to join the scheme (£30 for community organisations and £100 for businesses). Once you are a member your local co-ordinator (me) will contact you monthly to ask if you want to place an order (the minimum order is 500 litres). You place your order with the local co-ordinator who will submit the village total to CF (once submitted your order is regarded as binding). CF will then negotiate the best price from a range of suppliers. The local co-ordinator will then be in touch to advise you who the supplier is, the price per litre (exclusive of VAT) and the approximate date of delivery. Once the oil has been delivered the oil company will invoice you direct.

To join the scheme you will need to send a completed membership form and a cheque payment to CF, I can email a copy of this form to anyone that is interested, or it can be obtained on the website **www.communityfirst.org.uk** and follow the links to the Bulk Oil Purchasing Scheme. If you do not have access to the internet and want to find out more you can contact **Jess Emery on 01380 722475**.

CF will notify me of new member details as soon as they join. I will contact you as soon as I receive this notification. I am hoping to do this as much as possible by email, but I will drop off paper order forms and a list of order dates to anyone that joins who is not on email, and contact you individually to arrange how we will work the monthly ordering.

Please contact me if you would like me to send on any further information. There is also a lot more information about this on the CF website. The more of us that join the scheme the greater the negotiating power of CF and the greater the savings.

News from Pewsey Children's Centre

A Sure Start Children's Centre

If you are a parent/carer of a child aged 0-5 and you have not yet discovered Pewsey Children's Centre now is the time! This purpose built centre is on the same site as Pewsey Primary and Secondary School, and shares the building with Puddleducks Nursery and is open to all families in the Pewsey Community Area with children aged 0-5years.

Come along to Curious Creation on Wednesdays, from 10.30-11.30 We have a weekly Stay and Play Session in Woodborough Parish Rooms on Thursday mornings from 10.30-11.30.

The Children's Centre has a fantastic sensory room which can be booked free of charge for half hour sessions on Mondays, and there is a monthly Sensory Play session. On Monday mornings we run a 4-12month Baby and Beyond Group and on Tuesday mornings a 0-6 month TLC, where you can come and meet other families and discuss relevant developmental issues.

Tales of a Morris Cowley Part Four

Last month described the near demise of my 1928 Morris Cowley, now came the trick of restoring it at little or no cost!

The roof was easy, because whilst we were docked in Rosyth, I came across a rather nice canvas tarpaulin lying on the jetty. No one admitted to owning it, and with the assistance of a seaman adept at sewing canvas, we made a magnificent new roof. At the time, my captain was on leave and when he returned, he started asking for his car cover which he had left on the jetty. By this time the new roof had been painted black, and I fear I never owned up. None of the ship's company said a word and I have been feeling guilty ever since!

Shortly after the car had reached the point where it would go and could be driven long distances on the road I ventured down to London on leave, in the winter. Although I had a roof, there were no windows as I could not afford them! It was bitterly cold and even colder on the trip back. I had a lot of my kit in the car and planned to drive up during one day. I had to be on board the ship next morning looking respectable. By evening it was clear I would not make the Forth Bridge that night. I was, as usual, short of money and a hotel was out of the question. So I turned down a side road and camped. I slept in the car rolled up in everything I had – it was January, but luckily relatively warm and I hung several towels round the car in place of windows. In the morning, I woke to the sound of a stream gurgling down the hillside, feeling frozen stiff and in need of a wash and shave. So I removed one headlight, which was a solid brass bowl, lit a fire and boiled water in the headlight. If there had been a Guinness book of records I reckon that should be in it!

Eventually I managed to afford some new windows and a complete repaint and I drove all over Scotland including going to the Oban Ball from Edinburgh and back in the night. I arrived back at 8:00am, and still dressed in white tie and tails, gave orders for unberthing the ship! After some 18 months I moved to Rosyth Dockyard to join HMS GLORY, refitting for trials, and continued to drive up and down to and from London for weekends. I would leave Rosyth and cross the Forth by the ferry at about 4:30 pm and drive non-stop to London at a top, and cruising, speed of 55 mph. The return trip would be this in reverse on Sunday night. The one way trip took about 10 hours.

There were two memorable trips in this category. During the first one, on the trip back to Scotland, the collar which held the starting handle from falling out, came off and fell back into the sump. The bottom of the sump sloped up from back to front, so that, if the collar was in the back of the sump, and one braked too hard, it slid forward, up the slope, and kept getting hit by the front big-end. The remedy for this was to accelerate hard so that the collar slid to the back where the big-ends were clear of it. This was not really acceptable as I was worried for the safety of the big-ends and also the lugs with which the starting handle engaged were, of course, on the collar which had fallen off.

Next month will describe how this little accident was fixed!

ALL SAINTS SCHOOL NETHERAVON—NEWS RELEASE – JANUARY 2012

The school is very excited about its new sensory garden area including a new pagoda, for which all the hard landscaping has now been completed. A planting scheme has been devised and we are planning to hold a Family Planting Day during one weekend next term. We are also developing with advice from Wiltshire Wildlife Trust. The Wildlife Area has wonderful potential and actually extends into a wooded 'secret garden' behind the pond area.

Before Christmas, Netheravon joined other schools for the first ever Singing for Heroes Concert in The Wyvern Theatre, Swindon. To say that it was a success would be an understatement. The atmosphere was electric and the curtains opened to reveal a stage only lit by 150 hand held candles. It was magical. Our soloist Paige Dobson was phenomenal and the night raised over £3000 for Help for Heroes – a fantastic achievement.

The new term brings new activities and for out-of-school entertainment, the children can choose from art & craft clubs, maths games club, chess club, drama, singing for fun, Lego robotics, computer, judo and football clubs. If you are interested in running an after- school club, please contact Mrs Humphris. We are particularly keen to recruit enthusiastic and patient cooks willing to run either infant or junior cookery clubs. Please note volunteers will be subject to CRB checks.

This term will also see our Year 6 pupils learning what it was like to be a Victorian school pupil with a visit to Sevington Victorian School near Chippenham. They have to dress for the period and so do the staff!

For Global Link Day on 9th February the children will be keeping a diary on all aspects of their individual day from what they eat for breakfast to what they do after school and everything in between. When the journals are complete half of them will be traded with similar journals sent from our link school in the Gambia and the other half for another link school in Nepal. Keeping the multicultural theme, Beech and Rowan classes will be treated to an African drumming workshop by Kaya Drums on 20th January.

All you need is love! February is few people's favourite month, but it does contain a favourite date. Halfway through the month, on the 14th, it's Valentine's Day. It is, of course, beloved of the greeting card industry, but also of millions of romantically inclined men and women, otherwise totally sane, who take the opportunity to post a message of love in the hope that it will be reciprocated.

As the card is meant to be anonymous, this can lead to all manner of tricky misunderstandings, but hope springs eternal, and many a teenage heart has missed a beat or two on the morning of Valentine's Day. And there may be millions of couples all over the world who owe their happy marriages to one of these heart-strewn, beribboned cards with their doggerel protestations of undying love.

Few of those who send or receive them realise that February 14th is actually the feast day of St Valentine. That's hardly surprising, as we know very little about the person the day commemorates. In fact, there were two Christian martyrs of that name, both living in the third century, one a soldier and the other a bishop. No one has ever successfully found any link at all between either of them and courting couples and their desperate hopes. The most likely explanation of the association of this date with hopeful lovers is a very old tradition (at least as old as Chaucer) that birds begin to pair on February 14th - St Valentine's Day. As they noisily go about choosing their mates, young men and women pursue a rather more subtle, if more circuitous route to the same end.

Whatever its provenance, Valentine's Day at least reminds us of the irresistible force of love. 'Love changes everything', as the song says - or, as the Beatles put it, 'All you need is love'. The problem then becomes interpretation. In English the one word 'love' covers everything, from sexual relationship to motherly care, from close friendship to a lifelong partnership. Happily, the Greeks have more than one word for it. So the New Testament is able to establish that eros (sexual attraction), philadelphia (friendship) and agape (sacrificial love) are distinct qualities, yet all are part of the mysterious and wonderful chemistry of human love in its fullest sense.

'All that I am I give to you', the couple say to each other in the wedding service. What a thing to promise! And yet what a testimony to the deepest possible understanding of the love of God for us, and (in our better moments) of human love in all its tenderness, commitment and unselfishness. So physical attraction plus true friendship plus self-giving love add up to - well, everything that the Bible means when it says that 'those who live in love live in God, and God lives in them'(1 John 4:16).

LOCAL POLICING

In a recent case of burglary in South Wiltshire, the house occupants were only away from home for 30 minutes mid-morning, so they did not set the burglar alarm. Offenders broke in forcing a rear window, entered the premises, stole valuables, and were gone before the occupants returned. It means they must have been watching the house to carry out a burglary so quickly. If you keep valuables in your house, remember to review your security arrangements regularly.

Beware of a non-authorized Neighbourhood Watch website, which is called www.nhwo.co.uk and was launched on 14 December 2011. It is marketing a 'co-ordinators pack' at £39.99 which includes non-authorized items. 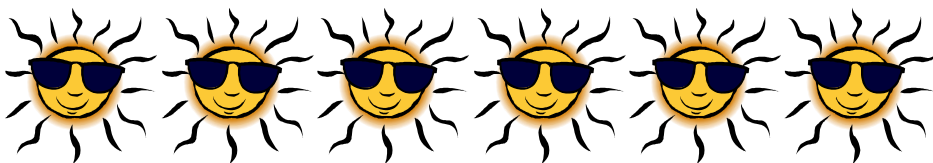

HIGHWAYS REPORT

Councillor Stan Bagwell has submitted the following report:

CONTENTIOUS ROAD SIGNS AT DEVIZES In November 2011 large highways signs appeared on the A361 and A342 at Devizes diverting all HGV coming into Devizes, and going south, down through the A342 and A345. One of these signs at the Le Marchants Barracks, at the A361 roundabout, also directed all HGV coming in from the A4 and going South down Windsor Drive through the Nursteed Housing Estate passing the Nursteed Primary School, then back onto the A342 south of Devizes.

At the moment it is not known who, within Wiltshire Council, authorised the erection of these signs or why - particularly in view of the fact that Wiltshire Council have consistently stated in the past that the A345 is not a recognised highway for HGV and that they recommend the preferred route of the A4 and A34.

The Pewsey Community Area Partnership are treating this total lack of consultation as a very serious matter, and are pursuing an investigation in order to determine why:

- ◆ To our knowledge there was no cross Area Board (3 boards are affected) consultation on this matter.
- ◆ The school affected was not consulted.
- ◆ Strategy consultation documents were ignored.
- ◆ The due protocol which we have to follow, appears not to have been followed by the County Council.

We await a response from the head of Wiltshire Highways on this issue.

ROAD NETWORK POLICY FOR THE A345 We are currently corresponding with Claire Perry MP who wrote to Mike Penning MP, the Under Secretary for State for Transport regarding use of the A345 for North-South HGV traffic. However the response from Mike Penning MP has so far failed to address our concerns.

C32 We aim to get this small rural lane (ie. C32) re-assessed regarding the 30mph speed limits through East Chisenbury and Enford.

STOP PRESS: Dog fouling in many areas is becoming particularly heavy. Dog walkers are reminded that soldiers train on the Military Lands and that faeces can remain for up to 90 days. Those in charge of a dog or dogs are required to take away their dog faeces for proper disposal.

TRAINING IN FEBRUARY

The first two weeks of February will be busy with significant numbers of armoured vehicles on both manoeuvre training and live firing. At the same time contractors will erect Afghan compounds across the Plain which in the interest of safety the public are asked to stay well away from.

6 - 9 February sees two major armoured exercises out of the Land Warfare Centre (Ex SABRES THRUST and Ex BADGERS STRESS) using the West and Centre of the Plain. Preparation for the 12 Mechanised Brigade Afghanistan pre-deployment exercise PASHTUN DAWN will continue with communications and logistic assets deploying onto the training area.

10 - 11 February sees the main body of troops and vehicles arrive in slow moving convoys. The exercise starts on 12 February and finishes on 11 March. It will use the whole Plain and involve some 8000 troops and more than 500 tracked and wheeled vehicles plus fixed wing aircraft and helicopters. Large convoys (of 80 vehicles or more), will operate on the training area. For safety reasons there will be no public access to the Larkhill Artillery Ranges or permissive use of stone tracks or dog walking off of rights of way in the Tilshead, Chitterne & Shrewton triangle (Copehill Down area) during the exercise.

Note Vehicle movement may cause delays at tank crossings and drivers should take care when approaching crossings as mud clearance parties and mechanical sweepers will be at work

Bulford Ranges. Rights of Way (PROW) through Bulford Ranges are closed when red flags are flying. No firing is planned for 5, 6, 19, 20, 25, 26 February .

Larkhill Ranges. Rights of Way (PROW) through Larkhill Ranges are closed when red flags are flying. No firing is planned for 5 & 6 February.

Note. In the event of range fires access may be denied to some areas due to the risk of unexploded ordnance "cooking off".

Imber. Difficult terrain and unexploded military debris make it hazardous to leave the marked routes. The public are excluded from Imber Ranges at all times, even if flags are not flying. 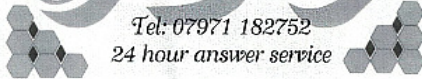
