

There is in the All Saints Cemetery, Enford a grave to Arthur George Eyres and his wife. My research shows that they married late in life and had no children. However, when we visited the Church there were fresh flowers on the grave.

I have now traced his family back and have established, through various spellings of our surname that his great-grandfather, George Eyres, was my great great-grandfather. George Eyres was recorded as being 76, the village grocer and blind in the 1851 census. My branch of the family moved to Wilsford, south of Amesbury, around 1900. My daughter currently lives at Tidworth, not far away.

My purpose in writing to you is to ask if you would include this e-mail in your Newsletter so that I could contact anyone knowing of Arthur George Eyres. I believe his wife was Alice Denning and his sister married Alice's brother.



#### The Ethics of Defence Estates Sponsored Shoots

A few weeks ago, in the middle of January, on a Saturday afternoon, I had the unfortunate experience of passing members of the shoot who perform their weekly ritual in the region of 'B' crossing and the plantations adjacent to the river.

At the time of my passing, there were more than 20 men encircling their 'bag' of pitiful spoils of some 3 pheasants and about a dozen wild duck.

I was deeply saddened to see that they felt obliged to supplement their meager pheasant 'bag' with such a haul of our local wild life.

As I walked by, one of the members described the day's spoils as being 'well worth it.' I reflected on this comment and wondered whether he referred to the frequency with which they had enjoyed the momentary rush of adrenaline when pointing their guns in the general direction of a wild duck taking flight in fright and then seeing it fall out of the sky?

Or perhaps it was the anticipation of a 'free' duck dinner to which he referred?

In their self congratulatory mood they would not of course have considered the impact of their actions - to deny we locals the pleasure of enjoying the diversity of wild life that our rural environment should provide.

Or indeed the impact of denying the local young children the pleasure of seeing a mother duck swim up the river with her young ducklings in tow, in spring.

Sadly it was several days, following the event in question, before I saw any ducks at all on the river, but not surprising given the uncontrolled shooting that had taken place.

I have no objection to the shooting of pheasants since the shoot introduces them into the local environment specifically for their 'turkey shoot'. However they do nothing to introduce wild ducks and therefore their right to shoot them and thereby diminishing the diversity of our wild life should be questioned.

Of course the shoot is licensed by Defence Estates to shoot pheasant and wild duck within certain times of the year, but we should remind ourselves that this shoot is taking place on public land, albeit land that is ceded to Defence Estates to manage – but manage and not exploit!

Defence Estates on their website espouse their sustainability credentials on the land that they manage. I would be interested to know what studies they have performed into wild duck numbers on the Avon that provides them with the confidence that such uncontrolled killing of our local wild duck population is sustainable.



# PARISH PLAN PROGRESS REPORT



The steering committee presentation to the Parish Council is scheduled for Wednesday 27 Feb so, by the time you read this, it should have taken place. After that there will be another presentation to the other village committees then, once we have received feedback, we will be holding a public meeting in the Village Hall to present the issues which have been identified and to discuss the way ahead. This will be followed by a second survey where you will have a final opportunity to state your priorities regarding which issues should be tackled in the Parish Plan, and the priority and resources to be allocated. In the meantime, here are a few more results based on the survey responses:

**Birth Place** 11% of the population were born in the parish – the rest of us are incomers.

**Employment** Almost half (48%) of us are in full-time or part-time paid employment, with 25% (second largest category) retired, and 17% in the education system. 20% of households have at least one family member who is either self-employed or runs their own business.

**Fuel** Most households rely on more than one fuel – most popular household fuels are: Oil (60%); Electricity (standard rate) (53%); Wood (46%). Despite heavy dependence on oil, only 6% of heating oil users belong to a bulk oil-buying scheme. At least a half of people, who use electricity to heat their homes, don't use Economy 7. Some useful reading:

- Bulk Electricity Scheme Wiltshire council are also participating in a bulk electricity-buying scheme (see <a href="http://readytoswitch.ichoosr.com/product/index.rails?actionId=252">http://readytoswitch.ichoosr.com/product/index.rails?actionId=252</a>). It's not yet known when the next auction will take place, but you can register your interest now by visiting the website.
- Economy 7 Current SSE prices per unit are: Standard Day Rate 15.21p; Off-peak 6.73p. If you are a heavy user of electric heating, then visit <a href="http://www.uswitch.com/gas-electricity/guides/economy-7/#step8">http://www.uswitch.com/gas-electricity/guides/economy-7/#step8</a> to read the pros and cons of switching to Economy 7 or Economy 10.

#### ENFORD CAMERA CLUB

Thursday 7th February saw several members of the ENFORD Camera Club arriving for the 8pm meeting at the village hall carrying their laptops with the intention of experiencing hands on demonstration of how to use Adobe Photoshop. One of our experienced regular users of Photoshop, Noeline Smith had volunteered to pass on her knowledge of the application to benefit other club members.

Adobe Photoshop is a graphics editing application popular for its extensive amount of features. Photoshop is also, currently, the leading graphics editing application.

Working on a pre-supplied set of pictures we were shown how to straighten, change the perspective and correct under-exposed pictures. Being such a powerful application Photoshop empowers the User to transform, use imagination and in some cases rescue a poor photograph.

Noeline caused mayhem and confusion when showing us how to "layer" pictures, an application offering which enables the user to change whatever part of their photograph they so wish. "Layering" deals with, amongst many things, changing the brightness and contrast separately within the foreground and background of a photograph. The Camera Club members spent an enjoyable and informative evening courtesy of Noeline and it quickly became apparent what a powerful, versatile application Photoshop was to use.

#### **Easter in Three Dimensions**

Films like Life of Pi or The Hobbit come alive when watched in 3D. As we celebrate Easter, it's good to ask, 'Do we see it in 3D or is our celebration simply one-dimensional?' It's easy to miss the true significance of the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. As C. S. Lewis said, 'Easter is not primarily a comfort, but a challenge. Its message is either the supreme fact in history or else a gigantic hoax.' So how can we see Jesus' resurrection in three dimensions?

The first dimension is the proof of the resurrection: The resurrection of Jesus was an historical event to which we have eye witness accounts: 'He appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, and last of all he appeared to me also.' (1 Corinthians 15:3-8). Jesus' resurrection also had a dramatic effect, as the church grew. It is a perfectly amazing story of peaceful revolution that has no parallel in the history of the world.' (Michael Green).

The second dimension is the promise of the resurrection: George Bernard Shaw famously said, 'Death is the ultimate statistic, one out of one of us dies.' As Jesus promised, 'I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die.' (John 11:25-26).

The resurrection of Jesus declares that he didn't die in vain, but has secured eternal life for us. When we believe and trust in Him, we can look forward to an eternity with God, with a body like Jesus! The resurrection of Jesus guarantees us a secure future.

The third dimension is the power of the resurrection: The resurrection is also a present experience, 'This is eternal life, that they may know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent.' (John 17:3). Eternal life is not just about life after death, but a quality of life to be experienced now i.e. 'life in all its fullness'.

Wilson Carlile, the founder of the Church Army was speaking at Hyde Park Corner, 'Jesus Christ is alive today.' A heckler in the crowd shouted out, 'How do you know?' Carlile replied, 'Because I was speaking to him for half an hour this morning!'

**Easter Opening of the Roads through Imber.** The road through Imber from Warminster to Joan a Gore's Cross and the roads from Heytesbury to Imber and from Bratton to Imber will be open from 1800 hrs on Friday 29th March (Good Friday) until 1800 hrs on Wednesday 3rd April.

#### TRAINING

1 Mechanised Brigade will continue its operational pre- deployment training on Salisbury Plain until Sunday 3 March. Ex PASHTUN DAWN, will take place across the whole Plain and involve some 9000 troops, in excess of 550 tracked and wheeled armoured vehicles, and both fixed and rotary wing aircraft. Large convoys, some in excess of 80 vehicles, will operate on the training area and there may be some disruption to civilian traffic at tank crossings. For the period of the exercise there will be no access to the Larkhill Artillery Ranges and permissive stone tracks in the Tilshead / Chitterne / Shrewton triangle (Copehill Down area) will be closed in the interest of public safety. Members of the public using Salisbury Plain for recreation during this period are required to keep to the public rights of way. Military convoys leaving the Plain at the end of the exercise may cause some disruption from late afternoon on Sunday 3 March until Tuesday 5 March.

During the weeks 4 - 31 March normal levels of training will resume as local armoured units from Tidworth and Bulford, and the Land Warfare Centre, deploy onto the area to conduct manoeuvre training.

Late firing on Larkhill Ranges on: 5th, 7th, 12th, 14th, 16th, 19th, 21st, 26th, 28th March.

Live firing on Salisbury Plain (East): Nil.
