

Email from MP Claire Perry re: Flood Damage

After last month's visit by MP Claire Perry visit to Inspect the Flood Damage the following email was received from her. **Unfortunately it came too late for the last issue** of the Newsletter and so the Flood Support Forum mentioned has already taken place


On Monday, 3 March 2014, 11:24, "PERRY, Claire" <claire.perry.mp@parliament.uk> wrote:

Over the last few weeks I have been contacted by many people across the Constituency who have experienced flooding to their homes and communities. My Devizes office has worked alongside Wiltshire Council to ensure that the right support has been available for people affected by flooding, and I have been working with Thames Water for many months on long term solutions for sewage issues in Great Bedwyn and Aldbourne.

I am pleased that Wiltshire Council has responded so actively with on the ground support over the last few weeks and has also announced a new Flood Resilience Scheme to help villages tackle the rising waters and also new Drainage Bye Laws that will give them more powers to tackle problems of water flow and ditch clearance. The Prime Minister has also announced new grants of up to £5,000 per property for flood defences. <u>https://www.gov.uk/government/uploads/ system/uploads/attachment_data/file/284174/Flood-Support-Schemes-guidance.pdf</u>

Now that hopefully, the worst of the weather has passed I am keen that we work together to ensure that our communities are protected for the future, and that people know where they can access support for both prevention and if flooding actually occurs. I have therefore arranged a Flood Support Forum to which affected communities and anyone concerned about flooding are invited. The event will be a Q&A Question Time style event and joining me on the panel will be senior representatives from Thames Water, Wessex Water, Wiltshire Council, The Environment Agency and a representative from The Great Bedwyn Flood Group, which has a great Local Flood Plan.

The event will take place at The Coronation Hall, East Grafton SN8 3DB on Friday 21 March 5.30pm-7pm (refreshments and an opportunity to meet other people affected or concerned by flooding from 5pm). COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

We often hear comments about drivers exceeding the legal speed limit as they travel through our villages, but who is prepared to give a little time and do anything about it?

The primary aim of Community Speed Watch, (CSW) is, simply by presence, to encourage drivers to observe legal speed limits. That said, details of offenders are recorded and forwarded to the police authority for action as necessary. There are currently more that 100 CSW teams registered to operate throughout Wiltshire. CSW has now been operational within Enford Parish since 2008 and during that time we have seen our offender rate reduced from a regular 12-15% to a fairly constant 3-6%.

To keep the momentum going, Enford team need more volunteers who must be over the age of 18yrs. No previous experience is required and you will be given a short course of instruction by Officers of the Road Policing Unit.


Combined meeting with Enford Camera Club - garden visit to Longstreet House (by kind invitation of Hamish & Jeni Scott-Dalgleish)

As the weather improves, this is an appropriate time of year to reiterate advice to drivers to secure vehicles when out dog walking. Beauty spot thefts are the curse of Wiltshire, but the parking spot does not have to be one of the county's monuments for the parked vehicle to be of interest to a thief. Ways to minimise risk of having your car broken into include:

Always - lock your car, close the sun roof and set any alarm.

Never – leave the windows open, leave high value items visible from outside the car, or leave coats or blankets in the car, a thief may believe the items are covering handbags. If possible – park in a public area, somewhere overseen by motorists on a road, where there are other vehicles parked, or somewhere overlooked by a dwelling, anywhere in fact where an offence is likely to be witnessed. At night try to park near street lights.

Reported incidents:

Offenders broke into a garage in Enford and stole tools. In Grants Road there was an altercation between neighbours involving shouting.

Community Beat Manager writes:

Well I am nearly approaching 7 weeks in the role and have made it around to all of the villages and spoke with many businesses and residents. I am conscious that I am only just scratching the surface at the moment but this is an ongoing process, and if we have not yet caught up hopefully we will over the coming months. There have been some great successes since I have started. We have seized 2 vehicles from uninsured drivers who are local to the area, one from Ludgershall, and one from Collingbourne.

We have also had some great drug successes in the last week catching 3 dealers and seizing thousands of pounds worth of class A and B drugs.

This has been down to proactive patrols by the team and some fantastic collection of information.

Although these successes have greatly pleased me it has highlighted a problem on the area, and I would appeal to all to continue to be vigilant and report anything that they may deem as suspicious no matter how small. If it does not warrant calling 101 please email <u>tidworthnpt@wiltshire.pnn.police.uk</u> and we will pick them up in due course.

As the summer months loom large on the horizon I would also like to remind everyone that if they are going to leave their vehicles unattended

that if they are going to leave their venicles unattended then please ensure no valuables are left inside. Thieves look for easy targets and if we can take away that temptation then we may prevent ourselves from becoming victims. Beauty Spots and dog walking areas are especially vulnerable.

Beware of out of date maps! Ordnance survey maps are updated periodically to incorporate changes and can soon be out of date. A large number of rights of way on Larkhill Ranges have been re-aligned and a further 3 in West Lavington, Figheldean and South Tidworth have been diverted. Following the legally required consultation, orders have been made and on or about the 20th of March the Definitive Map on the Wiltshire Council website will be amended. A plan of the new rights of way alignments on Larkhill Ranges can be found at the link above.

Flooding. DIO staff have been working with Wiltshire Council and contractors to help reduce the effects of recent and future flooding around the Plain and continue to respond positively to all requests from the Council. It is a relief for us all to see water levels falling.


