Please note that we will be offering same day appointments ONLY from 1 to 3 June 2016.

From Monday 6 June 2016 onwards normal services will resume.

Changes to how you access services

We have also taken this opportunity to implement some changes as to how we manage our appointments, based on the feedback you have given us.

Therefore, from 1 June, we will offer:

A GP walk-in service on MONDAY MORNINGS at both Upavon and Durrington Surgeries.

If you arrive at the Surgery before 1100am you will be seen by a GP or our new Nurse Practitioner, Lindsay Perrin. The service will work on a first come, first served basis. Please understand that, although you will be seen, you may need to sit and wait

Later opening times at Durrington Surgery.

The new opening times are 0800 to 1300 and 1400 to 1830, Monday to Friday. You will still be able to telephone the Practice between 1300 and 1400.

Evening appointments at Durrington Surgery from 1830 to 1930

Self-check in facilities at both Upavon and Durrington Surgeries

You can now book in for your appointment without having to gueue at reception

Lunchtime opening at Upavon Surgery

The new opening times will be from **0800 to 1730**, Monday to Thursday. You will still be able to telephone the Practice between 1730 and 1830

Friday opening at Upavon Surgery. The new opening times will be from 0800 to 1830.

Text messaging reminder service

We also offer a free of charge text messaging appointment reminder service which also allows you to cancel your appointment by simply replying to your SMS appointment reminder. If you would like to set this service up please speak to our reception teams.

Repeat prescriptions and medication

From **6 June** you will once again be able to order and/or collect your medication from Durrington Surgery.

If you changed your collection point whilst Durrington Surgery was closed and would now like to return to original arrangements, please let us know.

You can also order your repeat medication online, a quick, easy and secure way to order your medication.

If you have not yet registered for our online service please speak to our reception teams.



Thomas Stone took us through the development of the gardens planned by Graham Stuart Thomas in 1971. He discovered many old varieties of roses thought to have been lost or not seen for hundreds of years from China, Europe and even East Germany, thanks to the Berlin Wall being demolished. His slides showed the lovely borders overflowing with roses intermingled with giant white foxgloves, irises, catmint, alliums and bordered in deep blue lavender. There are so many varieties of roses being grown at Mottisfont – Galicia, Bourbon, Shrub, Moss and great banks of climbers and ramblers that we were almost overcome by their colours and blooms. It is a truly wonderful collection and a great tribute to one man's passion and vision which continues today. Do go and visit.

ENFORD PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2015/16

The Annual Parish Meeting took place on Wednesday 11th May. The following is the report from the chairman of the Parish Council

What is a Parish Council?

'Councils are the first layer of local government. They are elected local authorities, which aim to engage local people and respond to their needs, through representation as community advocates or by providing services. Activities are varied and diverse and have a range of functions, as community representatives on other bodies, powers to provide facilities, powers to be notified of proposals and surveys and other miscellaneous powers.'

I have included the above summary as a reminder of the main purpose of the Parish Council and can report we have had an extremely busy year fulfilling this brief.

The proposed application from BSRs for the Solar Farm at Coombe created a flurry of activity. Local residents were clearly opposed and the PC quickly responded to support their objections. We formed a small subcommittee and through weekly meetings undertook a number of activities. These included research to understand government policy (extremely difficult), visiting other PCs, communicating with Claire Perry MP and the Department of Energy & Climate Change, Archaeologists and many more bodies. We raised a fighting fund from residents which I am pleased to confirm was not used and the cheques have now been destroyed. We were delighted to hear that BSRs decided not to proceed with the application.

As many residents objected, we attended the consultation meeting re the proposed closure of the Everleigh recycling centre, we are pleased that WC decided it should remain open five days per week.

The application for the Gypsy and Traveller caravan site created a storm of emotions from local residents, generating literally hundreds of emails and other correspondence. We engaged with Netheravon and Fittleton PCs and worked, almost full time, methodically examining the application and presenting detailed valid objections to the proposal. Wiltshire Council rejected the application.

Last season the Community Garden and Playpark were maintained by Parish Councillors and other volunteers. This year we have engaged contractors and they have made a great start. Councillors, helped by our local police officer, installed a new bench seat in the Playpark and more recently we have renewed the basketball board and hoop.

The Parish Plan has been adopted by the PC. Steve Becker and the Steering Committee deserve recognition for their excellent work. We have produced a simple emergency flood plan and established a stockpile of sandbags and other equipment, we hope never to have to use them!

To help with our aim to be more visible within the Parish we installed a new, much clearer, notice board and each month published in the Newsletter photographs and articles showing just some of the many activities Councillors engage in.

This year we have increased the precept as by building our financial base it will enable us to do more for the community and also enable us to hold a contingency fund for any unforeseen maintenance or emergencies.

I would like to thank WC Charles Howard and the Clerk EPC for their support and more importantly, on behalf of all residents, thank the Parish Councillors who all undertake an area of responsibility and various activities, volunteering their time and efforts in helping make Enford Parish a great place to live.

Caring is part of being human and at the heart of family life. As our population ages and people live longer, often with complex health conditions, more and more of us will find ourselves caring with 3 in 5 of us becoming carers at some point in our lives.

A carer is anyone who cares, unpaid, for a family member or friend who cannot manage without their support. They might look after someone with a physical disability, long term health condition, mental health issue or a problem with substance misuse.

Many people don't identify themselves as carers, they feel they are just doing what anyone else would so they don't always know what support is available to them.

Carer Support Wiltshire is a local charity supporting carers in Wiltshire. They help them to access support, services, education and training and breaks from their caring role. As part of Carers Week (6th-12th June) they will be celebrating the contribution unpaid carers make to families and communities in Wiltshire with their Walk a Mile in My Shoes sponsored walk. A Team Vicar's Musings

By the time you read this I will be in the Holy Land experiencing the feeling of being in a place which has so many connections for me. I will be part of a small group, about 30, who will travel together not only physically but also spiritually. I only know three people in the group but that gives it an added piquancy as I wonder if I will like them and if they will like me.

Joining a group can be very difficult as we all have a set of ideas about the people we will be joining, even if like me you don't know the majority!

In June we will be starting another six weeks of the Pilgrim Course. "What is this?" I hear you ask.

This is a Course for those:

- who have recently started coming to church.
- who want the chance to think about Christian faith.
- preparing for baptism or confirmation.
- who have been Christians for many years and want to visit the roots of their faith again.

It comprises of six group sessions lasting for 1.5 hours for each subject. So far we have looked at the Lord's Prayer, the Baptismal Promises, The Commandments, The Beatitudes and The Creeds. This time we are looking at The Eucharist. Each set of group sessions stands alone and newcomers are most welcome.

Now you may have set ideas about the people who already are in a group, you might be worried that people will know more than you etc. I doubt if I can say anything that will calm any anxious feelings but I believe that the groups are made up of friendly people who, like you, are searching for answers to questions – and that includes me!

The Course starts the week beginning Monday 13th June 2016 finishing the week of Monday 18th July 2016. There are five groups across our Team during the day and the evening at various venues. If you want to know more either look in the churches or contact me.

I look forward to travelling with you on your journey, we may not go as far as the Holy Land but we will grow spiritually together.
