A word from Gale Hunt our Team Vicar:

This year, February 14th as well as being Valentines Day, it is also Ash Wednesday – the beginning of the Christian season of Lent. On Ash Wednesday many Christians will go to a church service to be 'Ashed' – to have a cross put on their foreheads in ash, made by burning last year's Palm Crosses, with the words, 'Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ.' The ashes are a sign of the spirit of penitence with which we shall keep

In our team there are two opportunities to worship on Ash Wednesday – 10am in Bulford Church and 7pm in Durrington Church. The introduction to the Ash Wednesday service says, 'Brothers and sisters in Christ, since early days Christians have observed with great devotion the time of our Lord's passion and resurrection and prepared for this by a season of penitence and fasting. By carefully keeping these days, Christians take to heart the call to repentance and the assurance of forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel, and so grow in faith and in devotion to our Lord. I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy word.'

So, part of what Christians are encouraged to do during Lent, is to spend more time in prayer and Bible study. As last year a booklet is being produced 'Praying Together in Lent 2018' and copies will be available in all our churches. This is to help us to read and pray thorough the Gospel of St Mark. Why not pick one up and join us in this daily reading and reflection or download the PrayerMate App. Or the booklet direct from the diocesan website - www.salisbury.anglican.org/worship/prayer/praying-together/signing-up-via-the-prayermate-app

Our weekly Lent lunches also begin on 14th February, so do join us if you can.




ENFORD VILLAGE HALL FILM CLUB

The pothole must therefore be reported direct to Aster Housing in order to be repaired. This is the case for any future potholes or other problems on Aster Housing land.

Horatio's Garden - Stephen Hackett

Stephen Hackett, the Head Gardener, will speak on the work of Horatio's Garden in Salisbury and the role of the gardens in supporting people with severe spinal injuries. The garden is named after Horatio Chapple, who was a volunteer at the Duke of Cornwall Spinal Treatment Centre in Salisbury in his school holidays. Horatio and his father, David, (Spinal surgeon at Salisbury Hospital) came up with the idea and Horatio drew up a questionnaire to find out what patients wanted. Tragically Horatio was killed at the age of 17 by a polar bear. Donations flooded in to create his garden, and it was opened in 2012, having been designed by Cleeve West. There are now three gardens and a fourth is in progress.

What to do with your date stones. HOW TO GROW A MEDJOOL PALM

- 1. Remove seeds from the centre of a date stone.
- 2. Place seeds in a dish and cover with water. Soak for a week (changing water each day)
- 3. After soaking for a week, rinse well and place in a dry paper towel, folded over.
- 4. Place in a plastic bag, seal and put somewhere warm.
- 5. Check occasionally; if mould spots develop, change the paper towel.
- 6. Soon roots will appear. Be patient!
- 7. Plant the sprouted seeds in potting soil. Keep the soil damp, covered in plastic and in a warm place until leaves appear.

Soon you will have a baby Medjool Palm.


NOTICE TO WALKERS ON THE ENFORD VILLAGE HALL PLAYING FIELD



ENFORD PARISH COUNCIL

EXCERPT from the Draft Minutes of the meeting of 9th January 2018 Held in the Village Hall.

Members of the public, Mike Germany and Robin Hibberd were also present 18/002 Public Questions

Mike Germany attended again to get an update on what Wiltshire Council are doing. Unfortunately Cllr Harbottle was not present however he has chased W.Council regarding the clearing of the verges to allow 2 cars to pass and also to cut back vegetation. W.Council says this will require a JCB and they do not have one available at present. Cllr Harbottle will to continue to chase for a result. Mike Germany said the rain over the Christmas period had made things worse and someone has slipped in the mud already. The dog mess on the path from Fifield to Coombe is as bad as ever. The Council will look at possibly purchasing a further bin to encourage dog owners to clear up after their dogs.

18/003 Police Matters & Neighbourhood Watch

As Police & Neighbourhood Watch Liaison, Cllr Exley said she would be attending a meeting organised for 16th April to try and gain closer contacts and information for the village. The Police Report listed no incidents for Enford in December. Cllr Waight said hare coursing was still active.

18/004 MOD/ Army Matters

WO2 Tony Broadbent reported on the incidents from 1st December to the present:

Incursions x 31 – 8 pedestrian, 2 cyclists and 21 vehicular

Fly-tipping x 9 – this was mainly household rubbish and old Christmas trees

Criminal Damage – there has been a lot of damage recently including 27 fences to be repaired, pens broken into, batteries stolen etc.

The Classic Car Rally on 30th December on Salisbury Plain did not apply for a licence this year. It appears that the event is now an actual race as 'winners' have been declared. A member of the public had their vehicle 'wiped out' at C crossing by a speeding rally car and Cllr Waight reported cars driving at night up to 100mph. With no licence, no Marshalls or Police to oversee the event, Tony has asked for as much advance warning for the future should they try to Rally again next year or organise another event during the year. There will be communications exercises up until 27th January and in February, (27th) to

March 11th Wessex Storm will take place for light wheeled vehicles. 'Wash' coming off the Plain at A & B crossing: Landmarc say this is the Army's

problem and Tony will ask the local Safety Marshall to inspect this.

Cllr Roberts also reported that black bins sacks of chopped up deer carcasses had been found near Silbury Hill. The deer management team would not have 'culled' in this fashion and it is presumed to be an illegal venture with no apparent gain.

18/005 Unitary Council Matters

Wiltshire/Unitary Councillor, Ian Blair-Pilling raised a couple of points by email.

Firstly, he is very aware of the continuing levels of service from Everleigh HRC and the implications for the future. He intends to remain very active with this alongside neighbouring councillors.

Secondly, he put forward an idea that circa twice a year the Chairman and Clerk should get together with him and the Community Engagement Manager, Marc Read, to discuss more local, village issues.

Cllr Roberts wants to engage W.Cllr Blair-Pilling with the ongoing problems with Coombe residents' broadband. Jonathan Lewis is attempting to get a fixed line infrastructure in place which could involve grant funding and the Parish Council will support Coombe as best they can with this.

18/008 Matters Arising

i. The Parish Hall

Cllr Cliffe-Roberts reported that the first meeting of the new Parish Hall Management Committee will be held on Monday 15th January at The Swan. This is not intended to be a public meeting but to elect relevant Officers. There will also be an update on the boundary dispute with Medina Cottage.

ii. Speed Indicator Devices (SIDs)

Cllr Roberts has spoken with Andy Stewart who has volunteered to look into the possible purchase of a SID. He has also spoken to Mr Wright who is in charge of the 5 devices in Durrington and a meeting between them plus Alan Day and Cllr Hiskett is arranged. From the Speedwatch point of view there have been fewer cars on the road over the last two weeks but their average speeds have been higher than usual.

iii. New bin at the Playpark

Cllr Christie-Rundle is due to meet her contact at IdVerde, Mr Spanswick, at Grants Road next week. She has a location in mind which would be visible as well as accessible to walkers in the field as well as path users.

18/009 Finance

Cllr Hiskett asked about the Police and Crime Commissioner's open consultation which proposes a further £1.00 per household per month. This is open to all individuals to attend and is not a Parish Council matter.

18/011 Parish Plan - Youth Funding

Cllr D'Arcy Irvine reported that, following several discussions with them, Wiltshire Council is now prepared to grant Enford a new lease of the land for a 125 year term as a special case. He is arranging for specialist play park suppliers to provide draft designs of layout and quotations. Equipment for the playpark and skate park could total circa £28,000. Once the agreement for the new 125 year lease has been finalised, applications for grant funding can be initiated. Total funds to date are c£1,350 and a vote of thanks goes to Tracy Southard for her hard work in fund raising. Cllr D'Arcy-Irvine said he would also look into the matter of providing a standpipe for the Allotment area.

18/012 Roads and Highways

Cllr Harbottle sent in a brief report regarding:

i.The potholes on the A345 near B Crossing have been reported but the current weather conditions will continue to make them appear.

ii. The pothole reported in Grants Road near Water Lane turns out to be on Aster Housing land and is not a Wiltshire Council road. Therefore W.Council will not repair this and the Grants Road residents will need to report this to Aster Housing.

18/013 Public Rights of Way (PRoWs)

Cllr Hiskett is still chasing W.Council for an updated map of the Public Rights of Way through Enford Parish. Cllr Roberts said the Camera Club were looking to create a 'visual' map for display in the village.

18/015 Any Other Business

Cllr Christie-Rundle suggested that the Parish Council should try to engage better with the 'youth' of the village which may help to stop the vandalism particularly at the Village Hall. Getting younger members of the village involved was agreed as a very good idea and she will be placing a note in the Newsletter to this effect. No younger members of the community (under 18s) would be allowed to be on the Parish Council but could easily attend a meeting and put forward ideas and suggestions to assist with the viewpoints of all age ranges in the village.

Cllr Christie-Rundle also mentioned some of the notices on the board were out of date. These were for events in the village.

Cllr Young mentioned the bank along the bend in the narrow part of Longstreet was encroaching again. This is where the house owner was asked to reduce the bank and remove the nettles growing along it as it was a hazard to pedestrians and cyclists. The problem will become worse in the summer.

Cllr Holdway suggested there should be a path up Water Lane

Cllrs Hiskett and Roberts will replace the latch (again) on the Playpark gate.

Cllr Roberts will mention the Car Rally s at the next Wiltshire Council Area Board meeting as well as to W.Cllr Blair-Pilling.

We're very lucky to have been given a series of 5 emails from Lisa Goodship, daughter of Jenny and Paul, Enford residents, telling her family about a short but eventful trip she made with her boyfriend, Dallas, to India. We will be publishing their story over the coming months and hope you all enjoy them. Lisa and Dallas currently live in New Zealand

Impressions of India

Part 1—In the Beginning...

Our adventure began not quite as we had planned. Dallas was delayed leaving Auckland by 6 hours which meant missing his connecting flight in Singapore and, having turned down the offer of luxury accommodation all expenses paid with the



same flight the next day, he decided time would be better spent flying to Mumbai and then change, getting an earlier flight on to Kochi with just the flight number scribbled on his luggage tag. They couldn't book him a ticket! I had a rather less eventful flight from Heathrow, disembarking 10 minutes before I was due to leave in Muscat and then I was told I had to "run quick" as final boarding had been called! I was collected outside departures and transferred blissfully unaware of Dallas' plight.

Now faced with my first night and day in India alone I had to don my "big girl pants" and venture out to find food and water! This came in the form of pizza and a cold 2 litre container of water; much needed in the heat of winter - 35 degrees! My first hotel was 'interesting' and I can't wait to show Dallas when we stay there at the end of the tour. I think the funniest sight though would be me bundled in to a rickshaw haring round the streets (driving - that's another story!) with my luggage as I transferred from the airport!

Today we started our tour in Kochi. There are twelve of us on our tour aged between 25 and 80. We wandered round the streets getting orientated in the district, learning the history and taking in the amazing sights - so

colourful and vibrant with horns tooting, rubbish littering the streets, goats wandering, beautiful silks, fragrant incense and so much more. We had a ride on a local bus travelling through streets laden with stalls and also saw the famous Chinese fishing nets and even got to practice pulling one up (we had caught 2 mullet - go us!) The area is famous for its silk, seafood and spices.



Tonight, we are off to watch a local dance show and hopefully find Dallas a beer! He has been forced to go alcohol free as the district has few places that are licensed to sell it and it's not sold in the shops. For the more refined lady like myself I am hoping to try a proper Indian chai tea tonight. The food we have tried so far has been beautiful and not too hot although no spice still means some heat as it's needed for the flavour. Tomorrow we head off on the train towards Coonoor and into the mountains where hopefully it's a bit cooler.


