A word from Gale Hunt, Our Team Vicar:

Happy Easter! Christ is risen!

At the time of writing it is Easter Sunday for Christians who attend Orthodox churches, as they follow a different calendar to us. In the Church of England we are still in the Easter season until nearly the end of May. On Thursday May 10th we celebrate Ascension Day (40 days after Easter day), as we remember Jesus returning to heaven. When I was at school (many years ago) we used to have a half day holiday and the shops used to close too, all because it was Ascension Day. Perhaps some of you remember that happening and how you used to spend it.

The Easter season finishes on May 20th as we celebrate Pentecost, the coming of the Holv Spirit on the first disciples. It is 50 days after Easter (the name comes from the Greek pentekoste, "fiftieth"). It is also sometimes called Whitsun. Pentecost is regarded as the birthday of the Christian church, so we often have great celebrations on that day and wear something red (the colour we use in church for the Holy Spirit).

Then on May 27th the party goes on as we celebrate Trinity Sunday. The Trinity is a core Christian belief rather than an event – that God is three and God is one - one God, three persons - Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It's a belief that people find hard to get their heads around, but a great illustration is in the book and film 'The Shack', so do read the book or watch the film if you get a chance.

So May is a month for celebrating, not only for Christians, but for us all as we hopefully welcome the warmer weather, the new life appearing in creation and enjoy spending more time out-of-doors appreciating the beauty of the place where we live.

- 3. Awards will be made to causes that benefit the community and not specific individuals
- 4. No awards will be made for greater than $\pounds 1000$
- 5. For any award to be granted there must be agreement by at least 75% of the committee.

ENFORD PARISH COUNCIL Excerpt From Draft Minutes of the Meeting of 10th April 2018

18/034 Public Questions

i. Tracy Southard asked about the progress with the renewal of equipment at the Play/skate Park in Grants Rd. She has done a lot of fundraising for this already with both parents and children. Cllr Roberts put forward the thanks of the Council for all her efforts to date. She has also been canvassing on Facebook for people's current opinions. Cllr Christie-Rundle suggested a survey to the younger members of the village and Rhys said that he had already made a start on this with some results to date and will continue to monitor these. He suggested a paper questionnaire in the news-letter. Anti-social behaviour was mentioned as a big concern.

ii. Mike Germany said that there used to be a salt bin at the top of road from Fifield to the A345. He would like a new bin to replace it. Cllr Harbottle said the W.Council salt bin in Grants Road which is on Aster property land could be re-located.

Mike Germany again raised the matter of dog mess on the footpath between Fifield and Coombe. Cllr Roberts explained there was not a lot the Council could do about it. He offered Mike some stickers to remind dog owners to clear up after their dogs. Cllr Roberts suggested another dog bin and Mike thought this might help.

18/035 Police Matters & Neighbourhood Watch

With no Police presence and in Cllr Exley's absence, Cllr Roberts read out the Police report: -Target Patrols at New Buildings – 26 patrols have been made by the Police since 20th February as a reassurance to the residents who had been reporting a wave of damage to their properties. -The perpetrator of a recent burglary in the village has since been traced to Pewsey.

-Again vandalism has occurred at the Village Hall where wooden bollards and handrails have been carved with a sharp instrument.

18/036 MOD/ Army Matters

WO2 Tony Broadbent was accompanied by WO2 Jeff Hayne who will be taking over his role. The arrival of 5 new Military of Defence Police Officers (MDPs) for the south west area will help with security and in the Landmarc renewal contract the MOD are requesting that the vedettes are once again manned. Incidents reported since 1st March include: 14x complaints – including one for noise and 8 for military vehicles out of bounds, 2x criminal, 7x environmental issues – one chemical/diesel spillage into the Avon and 5 fires which were all contained, 19x fly-tipping – fridges, freezers, mattresses plus two truck-loads of rubble, 26x incursions – including 6 off road bikes, 7 dog walkers, 2 bicycles and 1 drone

Exercise 'Joint Warrior' will be taking place between 23rd April to 4th May involving more aircraft and parachuting than usual. Wessex Storm will run from 11th to 30th June. Meanwhile there will be live firing at Warminster and Larkhill.

18/039 Youth Liaison

Rhys/Cllr Christie-Rundle reported a very successful meeting with Evie Chamberlain and Marc Read covering many topics and possibilities for Enford's Youth Liaison representatives. PC Lucy Wileman is keen to meet them and assist where possible and she explained about the Youth Café in Amesbury which Rhys and Evie are keen to visit. Whilst it was agreed that this would not be the best way forward in Enford it is hoped that Enford's youth might be encouraged to attend. Re. the extended Playpark area, Rhys explained further about his tick box survey which has so far produced 36 responses – 16 would like to have improved facilities, 15 would like to update the equipment and have the area re-landscaped. 25 (75%) said they would like the Allotments and other 'activities' that involve parents and children. Cllr Christie-Rundle said the preferred option would be 'a bit of everything' not just equipment focussed on one sport. At the meeting with Marc Read they had also raised the matter of drugs use in the village which is not being reported to the Police. Marc Read said this should be done if you actually see it happening. It is known to happen by the garages/Playpark area and by the Village Hall. Cllr Christie-Rundle was asked to put a note in the Newsletter targeted at parents, making them aware of the problem.

18/041 Matters Arising

iii. Annual Litter Pick.- Cllr Roberts reported this had again been a success with fewer bags collected than last year . He thanked all residents and Councillors who turned up to help as well as The Hub and The Swan for their 'refreshing' assistance. Cllr Harbottle said that the top of A Crossing was particularly bad. Cllr Roberts suggested this should be raised with the new MOD Liaison at the next meeting.

iv. Speed Indicator Devices (SIDs) Cllr Roberts will be getting one more quotation before the Community Speed Watch (CSW) group make a decision on the model best suited for Enford.

18/042 Finance

The Clerk reported that with the final bank statement at the end of the financial year the Parish held $\pounds 12,473.71$ in the account with a further 2 cheques totalling $\pounds 255.00$ not yet having cleared. The first tranche of the 18-19 Precept will be due to arrive in the account circa 20^{th} April and the auditing process is underway.

18/044 Parish Plan – Youth Funding

Cllr D'Arcy-Irvine reported no further news since the last letter from Wiltshire Council which indicated a high probability that the extended Playpark area would be transferred Freehold to the Parish. Following emails confirming agreement, it also contained draft Heads of Terms, though still waiting to hear from Wiltshire Council on whether this will be a 125 year lease or a freehold transaction. The cost to the Parish Council would be conveyancing and fencing off of this whole area. The Clerk will approach Aster Housing re. alternative access to the area so not to increase the traffic going through the housing and garage area. The Youth Fund account stands at £1,284 and it is hoped that everyone in the village will assist with various fund-raising efforts to get behind these plans. The Allotments were a very popular request on the original Parish Plan survey of 5 years ago. It is hoped there could be 12 small areas for villagers. A water supply to the area will also have to be arranged. If an 'Outdoor Exercise Park' was also important to the residents, this could be sited at the Village Hall but residents would need to raise money for it separately.

18/045 Roads and Highways

Cllr Harbottle reported that:

i. The break-up of one of the newly patched potholes has been reported.

ii A considerable number of the potholes between Long Acre and B Crossing were not repaired, also reported.

iii. Potholes northbound between West Chisenbury and A Crossing have been reported

iv. No date for application of final surface dressing of road between Long Acre and Netheravon.

v. No news on when the Parish Stewards will return to their normal duties

18/047 Correspondence

Cllr Roberts read out a letter to Mrs Bagwell which had been copied to the Parish Council from Wayne Meadows.

18/047 Any Other Business

Proposed that the Council purchase further dog bins for the Parish. After discussion it was agreed there should be one in Coombe/Fifield and one at the top of Water Lane. The proposer was Cllr Hiskett and the seconder Cllr Christie-Rundle. When the exact location is agreed, Cllr Christie-Rundle will organise the installation.

18/049 Date of Next Meeting

The Parish Council Annual General Meeting (AGM) will be held at the Village Hall at <u>6.30pm</u> on Tuesday 15th May 2018

This will be followed by **The Annual Parish Meeting at 7.30pm.** All residents are welcome and there will be refreshments/wine available.



Impressions of India

Part 4 - Greetings from Mamallapuram, Day 8 of Our Tour

Since our last instalment we have spent a night in the jungle, visited temples and palaces and spent the night on a sleeper train.

We started off by heading to 'Jungle Retreat', Masinagudi. Our journey was via the steep decline, which is prohibited to buses, we therefore split into two cars. We chose to walk a couple a km down the road. Taking in the stunning scenery of the Nilgiri mountains and surrounding national park. Our accommodation was in the Mudumalai tiger reserve in the Nilgiri biosphere. The room for the night was a mixed dorm, but being Valentines Day we decided to upgrade to a tree house! Our tree house was three flights of steps hidden in the canopy of a group of trees. Inside, we had 360 views of the treetops and surrounding area. Even the toilet and shower allowed you to observe outside, probably not so good for any looking in!! It was also the best shower we have had since the beginning of the tour. Warm and powerful - who would have thought halfway up a tree!!

Upon our arrival we had a orientation and safety talk. Being advised to walk only on the stone pathways and between the hours of 6pm to 10pm between the bar and restaurant only. After 10 we were not allowed outside of our rooms unless accompanied by a guard - having watched the video footage of animals that frequent the area we understood why! Tigers, leopard, elephants and snakes....We were advised the rooms were completely sealed and sanitized daily to help prevent any unwanted visitors. This was a relief until we saw the practicality of this up in tree house!!

We were also excited to hear there was a swimming pool. A welcome luxury in the hot humid 36 degree heat. However again we smiled, when discovering the pool also doubled as the local waterhole for wildlife!! They filter the pool twice daily and use only enough chlorine that allows for both human bathing and animal hydration!! I must admit there was actually something quite special about cooling off in the pool, surrounded by spotted deer and later knowing that the elephant that walked past our tree house later that night was getting as much relief from the water as we did.

Later that evening we boarded our jeeps for a evening safari. As much as we'd hoped to be lucky enough to see tiger, we knew this probably wouldn't be reality. Few people actually see tigers (our tour guide has never seen one in the wild) due to their shy nature and ability to blend into their natural environment. We were not disappointed though. The guar, bison, elephants, stalks, mouse deer, sloth bear, spotted deer, sambar, peacocks, langore, mongoose, giant squirrel and chameleon all made for amazing viewing!

The next morning we decided to embark on an additional safari too and got to see birdlife including hornbills, eagles and parakeet.

The next day we boarded a bus to Mysuru, driving through Bandalor National Park and across the Karnataka plains. Here we visited the stunning maharaja's palace, home to the

prince. And the Kesheva and Chamundi temples, places of Hindu worship

The next day we visited the local markets an array of vibrant flowers, fruit and vegetables. All displayed in towering pyramids and piles with many men, women and children shouting and bargaining. Bags full of flowers heads being sold by the handfuls or being meticulously threaded into beautifully smelling garlands and lais for decoration and hair pieces.

That evening we boarded our overnight sleeper train to Chenni. We travelled the 11 hours with locals in our first class, air conditioned carriage. Believe me again expectation far exceeded reality!! It is a real experience. One you encounter together and can laugh about in the morning. Trying to work out how many hours you actually slept through the snoring and jolting. Laying under your blanket and sheets on your triple bunk. Converted from 2 opposing seats, each previously seating 3 people. Another 2 sitting adjacent, forming the 6 berth area!

Upon arrival in Chenni at rush hour, we boarded a bus for our 1.5 hour trip to Mahallapuram. A quieter village with a relaxed feel and meandering streets to the beach - the Bay of Bengal. Here we had a bike tour around the local area. We visited local temples and sites including the 'Shore temple' and 'Butter Ball' - a huge rock suspended on a slope, balanced in place by its centre of gravity. We also saw many other large boulders which had been carved into amazing intricate figures and designs, some 700 years previous.

Here in Mamallapuram was also where I have purchased my first pair of colourful Indian trousers. Made in a shop opposite our hotel by a local man. I was advised I could also pick any design of trousers/shirt/dress/skirt, then the fabric design, colour and type of my choice and that it could be made and collected later that day, some after 1 hour!! Hopefully my new pants will provide a welcome coolness.

Today we are heading south by bus to Pondicherry via Aurovile


