

Whilst this is not an immediate requirement, I should like to thank all those who have 'registered' their willingness to assist with, shopping, collecting prescriptions, doing urgent errands, dog walking etc. for those who may have to self-isolate. I don't anticipate having to call on anyone immediately but in the more distant future, this may be necessary. At least we are prepared.

A word from Gale Hunt our Team Vicar:

The Easter holidays are about to begin, and I do hope that those of you who are having time off over the Easter period, have a relaxing and refreshing time. But perhaps in the current situation we find ourselves, you are having to self-isolate. Taking time out to rest and relax, to recharge ourselves is important for our wellbeing. There are many references in the Bible about the importance of rest, in particular that one day a week should be set aside to rest and relax.

Jesus also said, "Are you tired? Worn out? Burned out on religion? Come to me. Get away with me and you'll recover your life. I'll show you how to take a real rest. Walk with me and work with me - watch how I do it. Learn the unforced rhythms of grace. I won't lay anything heavy or ill-fitting on you. Matthew 11: 28-30 (Message Translation) Part of coming to Jesus and keeping company with him is to gather with other believers to worship and learn together. In a joint letter, Archbishops Justin Welby and John Sentamu said it was now necessary to put public services on hold until further notice. But they said that far from having to “shut up shop”, the Church of England must face the challenge by becoming a radically different kind of church rooted in prayer and serving others.

4. No awards will exceed £1,000.
5. For any award to be made, there must be agreement by at least 75% of the Committee.

Wiltshire Council Launch the “We’re Targeting Fly-tippers Campaign”

Wiltshire Council has launched a reward campaign to reduce fly-tipping throughout the county. They are urging anyone with any information about fly-tipping in Wiltshire to report it to them with as much information as possible, and any successful prosecution will earn a voucher of up to **£200** for the person who reported it.

IMPORTANT: Do not try to rummage through or disturb the waste, as this could affect the scene and put people in danger. It is also essential that people do not attempt to confront anyone who is fly-tipping or put themselves in danger in any way.

WILTSHIRE CRIMESTOPPERS

We work with County Police Forces to help reduce crime in our communities and to protect vulnerable individuals. Crimestoppers nationally runs a large number of campaigns each year educating the public about different crime types and appealing for information. The national website is www.crimestoppers-uk.org. should you want to find out more.

In Wiltshire, we are trying to increase our reach to the public with a number of initiatives to make our communities more aware of our service and encourage its use. We are also looking for volunteer 'Ambassadors' within individual parishes to help us stay aware of local issues and promote the use of the service.

Public reporting of crime and anti-social behaviour using 999 or 101 is sometimes inhibited through fear of identification, and thus also of recrimination or reprisal. In providing a 100%-guaranteed anonymous reporting system through Crimestoppers using the number 0800 555 111, we hope to overcome those fears and thus make our communities safer for all. In the last year alone, anonymous reports of crime to Crimestoppers in our county have led to a number of convictions.

One of our objectives this year is to make more people in Wiltshire, especially the more vulnerable members of our communities, aware of the Crimestoppers reporting service through the parish magazines of the County. We hope, for example, to keep the Crimestoppers logo and contact details constantly in the public eye through regular placements in publications such as these.

Finally, as a volunteer Committee we are always looking for people to help our cause and kindly give us their time to make our communities safer; if you know of anyone who may be interested please do let me know.

A Taste of South America! Episode 2 ...following straight on from last month

Day 4. This time we took a taxi into to the northern highlands which neighbour the Colombian border. Our driver/guide was an Ecuadorian man who was born in the Amazon. Previously a university lecturer, we had a great time listening about his day to day life and experiences, including a story about a friend and his son who had been kidnapped by Columbian drug lords. Theirransom was a \$150,000US and they spent 14 months in the jungle before escaping.



Our highland journey took us through many towns, each famous for its own particular craft; Cotacachi its leather; Cayambe its roses (and, to our surprise, the biggest exporter in the world and where 24 roses cost a mere \$2US); and our first stop, Otavalo for its textiles and large Indian markets. Many people in

Otavalo are still very much involved with their traditions and cultures. The men wear their hair long and plaited, broad-brimmed hats and white trousers. Women wear colourful, embroidered blouses and many bead necklaces. Unfortunately, we only spent about an hour at the markets but I still found time to purchase a beautifully soft alpaca scarf or two! We then went to Condor Park, a rehabilitation centre for birds of prey. Despite the commentary being in Spanish, we were still able to enjoy the flight displays and seeing some of the largest eagles including Harpies and Condors.



Day 5 our guide from the previous day had advised us to do a half day tour and visit Mitad del Mundo, the location of the equatorial line latitude 0.00, 23km north of Central Quito. We visited the museum and learnt about Equador's indigenous cultures and tribes. There are still two Indian tribes living within the Amazon who don't want any contact with or from the outside world and will kill any intruders! Another, we learnt, used to practice shrinking heads. This involved the beheading of an enemy

to kill them, or from a deceased, important tribal member to protect their spirit. This practice was banned in 1970, but continues with the use of animals. The procedure involves removing the skin from the skull and a process of shrinking the head to the size of a fist. It was then used as a trophy for rituals or trade.

We also took part in a variety of activities to see the different effects of the forces from the northern and southern poles, including which way the water goes down the plughole in the northern and southern hemispheres and at the equator. I was also pleased to learn you weigh 3kg lighter at the equator. Great news as we were about to learn how chocolate is made! Interesting fact, the purest and healthiest part of the coca bean, the powder from inside the roasted bean, is rarely used in the chocolate making process. The chocolate we all know and love is usually made from the bean's hard shell, ground up and mixed with lots of sugar and milk. I can highly recommend the real deal 100% chocolate.



That morning we also visited Pulumahua, a volcanic crater which is home to a farming community of 150 people. The residents here are generally very poor and elderly, the younger moving closer to towns. They have no cars, their only way out being a 90minute walk out. Inside, the crater has its own microclimate with cloud and/or rain each day, generally from about 1pm. The soil being so fertile means vegetables and crops grow well here and the people are pretty much self-sufficient. They have cows, chickens, goats and Guinea pigs for meat and will usually walk into town once a week to sell their produce.

Today was also the start of our Galapagos and Peru adventure and we met with another 14 other passengers who would be travelling with us. They included 2 Swiss, coming to the end of their round the world trip. 6 Australians, 5 Brits and an American. After our introductions we headed out as a group to see and learn about the city of Quito including the Basilica Church, town square and where not to venture!

Next month we'll be following Lisa around Quito and beyond.

ENFORD PARISH COUNCIL (Future meetings currently cancelled) **Abridged Draft Minutes meeting of 10 March 2020**

20/020 Public Questions

Mr John Poole-Warren wanted to correct the minutes of 14th January where a wrong impression was reported. He is not against the Royal Artillery Museum (RAM) as a project but against the venue. A discussion was had on various aspects of the project and the feelings for and against it. He wanted to know what was the opinion of the Parish Council.

... when the full detail of the Application is known, a public meeting could be held for everyone to air their views. The Parish council would take all views into account in representing a collective position.

20/023 Unitary Council Matters

WCllr Ian Blair-Pilling stands for the Collingbournes and Netheravon Division on Wiltshire Council. His portfolios include IT, Digitalisation and Operational Assets (their buildings) from offices to depots, leisure centres and libraries. WC are reducing their carbon footprint by investing over £5million in improvements that will pay for themselves in about 9 years and thereafter reduce costs by around £500,000 a year. They are also reviewing the leisure centre provision county wide. On the IT front he is involved with changing and upgrading the county's old and complex systems to create an easier and more efficient system for everyone's benefit.

-On the matter of Coronavirus he reported that WC Public Health is dealing with the various aspects of planning several steps ahead, alongside central Govt. W.Cabinet are being briefed regularly. The balance to be struck is only imposing restrictions when they are required rather than overreacting and creating other problems. The message to date is personal hygiene and common sense. Further and regularly updated information is available on the Wiltshire Council website.

20/026 Matters Arising

iii. Speed signs. These have been delivered and the first sign was put in place. Due to an anonymous message to WC, presumably left by a resident, WC arrived within days and removed the sign assuming it was on Council land and sited without permission. It transpires it was on Landmarc land and nothing to do with WC. After a brief discussion it was suggested the anonymous complainant might like to attend the next meeting and explain why they are against efforts to reduce speeding in the village. Consequently the Council has approached residents whose private roadside land offers a good site on entry to the village and they have been asked if they would object to a sign being located on their land. Three helpful residents have agreed. The Council thanks them for their consideration and support in the fight against speeding vehicles.

iv. Annual Litter Pick. This event has been organised again by the Parish Council. It will take place on Saturday 21st March. All volunteers are requested to meet at 10.30am at the bus stop at the bottom of Enford Hill to collect pickers, gloves and bags etc. Routes will then be chosen and cleared, returning to the meeting point at around 12.30pm. The 'Hub in the Pub' (Pete and Emma at The Swan) have again offered to thank those taking part with free teas, coffees, bacon butties/burgers etc. The Parish Council wants to thank Pete and Emma for their continued support.

ix. Royal Artillery Museum. Further discussion was had on this and it was agreed by all Cllrs that a Public Meeting would take place in the future. WCllr Blair-Pilling said it should be held with objective views, it is not a referendum or a petition. A date for this will be available once the Planning Application has been published.

20/030 Parish Hall

Cllr Cliffe-Roberts reported that: i. The Parish Hall Management Committee (PHMC)

had held a meeting on Monday 2nd March at which meeting he had been re-elected as Chairman, and Richard Roberts was elected Vice-Chairman.

ii. Emma Nutt had been welcomed onto the committee

iii. The Hall building has now been demolished and the site fenced off for safety, although the demolition has not yet been completed as some structural brickwork at present remains in-situ.

iv. With the building removed, it has been possible to carry out a precise measurement of the site.

v. An initial approach to Wessex Water (WW) to discuss the village sharing their access path (which runs along the south side of the Hall site), had gone well - however, apparently following representations made to WW by a local person, they are not now prepared to proceed with concluding any agreement for the shared use of the path until planning consent for the Hall site has been received.

vi. With precise site dimensions of the site now available, PHMC will now recommence discussions with Wiltshire Planning and Highways departments, to establish an acceptable layout for the future use of the site. WCllr Blair-Pilling undertook to engage with WC Planning Dept on behalf of the PC regarding the dimensions of the parking spaces.

vii. The draft Funding Agreement was discussed, in relation to the cost of demolition.

viii. The next meeting of the PHMC will be after progress has been made with Wiltshire Council Planning and Highways.

20/031 Roads and Highways

Cllr Coulthard reported that the application had been made to have a speed reduction on all the roads in and out of the village (barring the A345). He is working well with the Parish Steward and reminded the Council to contact him with jobs around the village for the Steward to attend to. Cllr Waight said part of the A345 between his and Cllr Coulthard's house is starting to collapse. Cllr Roberts said the road where the car had recently exited into Cllr Waight's field was cracked and also mentioned that the new battery for the SID should be arriving this week. On another matter, he had been contacted by a resident who was concerned about the car parking by the pub. An ambulance was recently unable to get through the parked cars to her house/drive. Pete Jeffries already has a (no) parking sign in place which appears to be being ignored. Cllr Exley asked what had happened with the idea of excess cars parking in the Church Car Park. Cllr Hiskett stated that there is an existing arrangement with the PCC for the Church car park to be used as an overspill for the pub customers, however there is no sign to advise pub-goers of this. Cllr Hiskett suggested The Swan may be prepared to share the cost of producing and erecting a sign directing customers to the Church car park. [Following the meeting, The Swan has agreed to this proposal].

20/034 Any Other Business

-Cllr Roberts reported that he had attended a meeting in Tidworth with the MoD and Landmarc on Ash die-back on the Plain. Over the next three years they are planning to remove 30,000 trees and advised there would be some disruption on the A345 when this happens.

-He also reported that he and Cllr Waight had met with Landmarc on another occasion regarding trees in the river and those that may soon be there. Landmarc have agreed the work needs to be done but the ground is too wet making it dangerous as well as difficult to deal with at the moment.

-Cllr Roberts introduced Mrs Charlotte Clark to the Council. She is willing to join the PC and will be officially co-opted at next month's meeting.


