A word from Philip Bromiley our Team Rector: Looking ahead

Pineapple Flavoured Ice Cream

It's summer and it's hot and you want a simple chilled desert with a bit of a difference. You could do worse than try this simple Pineapple Flavoured Ice Cream
Serves 6 but remainder will keep in the freezer.



Ingredients

1 pineapple (about 1.25kg/2.4 lb)

50g/2oz caster sugar

2-3 tablespoons cherry brandy/brandy/orange flavoured liqueur

Approx 450ml soft scoop vanilla ice-cream

Method

Remove skin, eyes of the pineapple and cut 6 slices from which you should remove the core.

Set the slices aside.

Puree the rest of the pineapple (including the core) together with the caster sugar and liqueur. Leave to stand for 15 minutes.

Whip the puree into the ice-cream and return the mixture to the freezer for at least 2 hours.

To Serve

Allow the ice cream to soften for about 10mins then serve scoops of it on top of the pineapple rings. Leave as is or sprinkle with chopped nuts/crumbled biscuits and/or add a sauce of choice.



We're very lucky to have received some local history from residents who would like to remain publicly anonymous. They've clearly put a great deal of effort into producing these articles, not least in painstakingly typing up some of the articles. They've kindly agreed to continue providing material for a series of which the following is the start.

LET'S GO BACK, BACK IN TIME.... PART 1

Whilst sorting through some old picture frames a copy of the Wilts, Berks & Hants County Paper came to light, having been used as the backing to a picture. It's a large 40" x 27" broadsheet (bit difficult to read at breakfast time!) and has a wide circulation – "circulates in the towns and villages of Wilts, Berks & Hants".

The date is Friday May 15th 1931 (90 years ago!) and what a mine of information it has been in relation to this area. From the small ads to the sport reports, village news to crime, it covers everything and gives a wonderful insight into those times between WW1 & WW2.



The following are a few extracts from it which relate to the local area and no doubt many of the names mentioned will be familiar to current readers of this Newsletter.

Chisenbury

Sunday School Anniversary

The Primitive Methodist Sunday School anniversary services were held on Sunday last when Mr T Beasant of Andover was the preacher. The attendance was large, especially in the evening. In the afternoon there were recitations, dialogues and special hymns rendered by the children.

These were most creditable to the scholars nearly all of whom took some part and Mrs H Perry, the organist, who was chiefly responsible for training and accompanying throughout the day. Prizes were distributed for regular attendance which as a whole has been good throughout the year. One scholar, Frank Perrett, had made unbroken attendance for three years and Alfred Sanger made full attendance during last year while Betty Goodship, L Sanger, Mabel Perry and Peggy Rutter were only absent once. Under the superintendency of Mr Herbert Goodship and with an earnest teaching staff, this school, which numbers over 40, is in a flourishing state. It is regretted that owing to change of circumstances, Mr Goodship finds it necessary to resign the superintendency. He is however being succeeded by a keen worker in Mr C Rayment. During the services collections were made for the Sunday school funds.

Upavon v Everleigh



ENFORD PARISH COUNCIL

The Newsletter kindly reserves two pages for news from the Parish Council in every edition. This normally contains abridged Draft Minutes from the most recent Parish Council meeting. In this instance, it was on Tuesday 15th June however, due to unforeseen circumstances the Draft Minutes are not yet available. They will appear in full on the Parish Council website as soon as they are available at www.enfordparishcouncil.gov.uk.

To precis information from the Parish Council AGM and the Annual Parish Meeting (APM) which were held on 25th May (The Newsletter's printing deadline was 22nd May!):

Parish Council AGM –Richard Roberts was re-elected as Chairman and Mark Hiskett was re-elected as Vice Chairman. All Councillors are on the 'Planning Committee'. Cllr Hiskett has agreed to retain his roles as representing the Public Rights of Way and the Parochial Church Council, Cllr Rob Coulthard retains the Roads and Highways role including the liaison for the Parish Steward and Wiltshire Council Highways Dept. Cllr Jane Young retains her involvement with the Enford Youth Club (based in Netheravon) as well as the Playpark – site and equipment. Cllr Anthony D'Arcy-Irvine retains his representation with both the Village Hall and the Amesbury Area Board (Avon Valley Division). Cllr Peter Cliffe-Roberts continues to represent the Parish Hall site/ development. Matters concerning the Police Liaison and Neighbourhood watch role is represented by Cllr Charlotte Clark and Cllr Bruce Waight retains his position as Flood Warden. Some Cllrs have no specific representational role which does not mean they do nothing but assist where required or requested. All Cllrs. are volunteers (most are 'working' during the day as opposed to being 'retired' – neither adjective implies doing nothing!) and work together as a team to make the Parish of Enford as best as possible for everybody.

Annual Parish Meeting (APM) – Richard Roberts kindly agreed to 'chair' this meeting. It was a shame that only two residents turned up to join in/report however it is always good to know how things are progressing for the different areas of interest in the Parish. Police – Information was taken from the Annual Police Report and whilst some figures quoted looked rather high, the area covered in S.E Wiltshire is large and the crime figures were for the most part 'town based' i.e. Tidworth and Ludgershall. Enford is very lucky to be a relatively low crime area and our local Police Officer Sharon Duggan has said she is happy to be contacted direct if necessary, her details are Sharon.duggan@wiltshire.pnn.police.uk or 07586 496262. Physical Police Officer numbers are low which means all Officers are stretched and are very busy. All Noticeboards carry emergency tel. nos.

- Wiltshire Council – WCllr. Ian Blair-Pilling was also re-elected in May and is Vice Chairman of the Avon Valley Division of the Area Board, working alongside Cllr Graham Wright of Durrington as the Chairman. He has returned to the Wiltshire Council Cabinet with responsibilities to Governance, Leisure & Libraries, Facilities Management, Operational Assets and Broadband. Should anyone need to contact him his details are ian.blair-pilling@wiltshire.gov.uk and 01980 670821.

- As with the rest of the country, the last year has meant all sorts of changes and difficulties are being faced, be they personal or financial, and this applies to Village Groups, clubs etc. All reports received 'just happened to mention' that times have been and still are tough but fortunately we all still seem to be here!

- New for the Village Hall this year will be the Summer Activities week run by Wild Life Camps for children aged 4 – 12, Monday 26th July to Friday 4th August. As this is a new project for the Village Hall it is hoped that attendance (it is on your doorstep!) will be high. This is not just for Enford but the whole surrounding area and you will see posters, advertising and information on this very soon (if not already). Do please spread the word to your friends and family and give this event the best start and support possible – it is ultimately to your benefit and the general prosperity of the Village Hall. For further information please contact Judy D'Arcy-Irvine or look out for the advertising....

- The Parish Hall and Reading Room are once again back on track. It may look like a derelict site but it has taken 10 months to get a response from Wiltshire Council on a pre-planning Application which was literally received on the afternoon of 25th May. The Plans for the Car Park (leased spaces only, covering 27% of the area available) and the Village Garden (73% of the area) are now finally being drawn up for submission and the Parish Hall Management Committee (PHMC) will be busy working out the logistics of converting the site as agreed by the Parish at the Open Meeting some two years ago.

- From the Report received at the APM, The Youth Football Club are in need. Upon further enquiry, they need new goal posts. At the meeting held on 15th June, this was discussed by the Parish Council and all Cllrs agreed that these would be purchased by the PC. By the time you read this, they should have received a few kicks and scuffs, a few goals, cheers and given the Club support but more importantly, they should have given all our youngsters a boost of happiness and self-confidence – a life-time goal!

- The Camera Club has suffered a difficult 18 months with some of its members literally moving away, not just from the Club. Their enthusiastic remaining members have been meeting virtually throughout this period and have plans to 're-brand'. This Autumn they will be changing their name to the 'Enford Photography Club' and inviting guest speakers etc to stretch everyone's interest in the many aspects and possibilities within photography. New members and new thinking would be welcomed and hopefully everyone will be invigorated and excited with the re-brand. For further information please contact Liz White at fieldview8@gmail.com.

- Moving on to the latest events/updates from the **meeting of 15th June** -The Village Litter Pick had the 'go ahead' despite the lockdown easing being moved out by one month. The discussions and consultations concerning the Enforcement Appeal by the owner of the Old Mink Farm passed its deadline date for letters of concern and the Enforcement Inspectorate started their deliberations as to whether or not the Appeal should be upheld or denied. As usual, warnings for everyone to be alert to unusual behaviours or suspicious looking people who may be related to crimes such as burglaries, property damage, vehicle theft, poaching, hare coursing etc. Discussions held on various Planning Applications in the Parish where the PC respond to the W.Planning Dept with any comments or local knowledge and notification from the W.Cllr on major items that may/will affect Enford in the future such as county roadworks which could change the traffic flows on our roads.

All in all, it was a good and informative meeting and as mentioned earlier, as soon as the draft Minutes are available for publishing, they will be found in full on the parish website and – space allowing, on all the Noticeboards.

The next meeting is on **Tuesday 13th July at 7.30pm in the Village Hall**. Members of the public are welcome to attend but please first notify the Clerk - an email from the PC website with your name/contact phone number is all that is required for Track and Trace purposes, should they be required.

GARDENING TIPS FOR JULY AND AUGUST



Alan Titchmarsh's comment for July is "If you don't have a good show of flowers now, you're not trying"!! We'll ignore that comment as he clearly hasn't had the kind of year that we've had in Wiltshire, particularly during June when it veered from 26 degrees down to 12 and back up again, not to mention the torrential rain or drought conditions.

June and July are most definitely the best months in my garden and I do hope it's the same in yours. It's the culmination of all that preparation throughout the rest of the year and it's important to sit back and enjoy it.

However, still jobs to do:

1. **GOING AWAY ON HOLIDAY:** If you're going away, make sure you water well (perhaps set up an automatic watering system), pick fruit and veg and feed your greenhouse plants. Kind neighbours can come in very handy here! Lock up the shed!
2. **GRASS:** Raise the cutting height of the mower during hot, dry spells to keep the grass green. Keeping the edges trim makes all the visual difference!
3. Prune and deadhead roses, prune philadelphus, wisteria. Deadhead bedding plants, perennials and flowered stems of delphiniums and lupins as they go over. Try not to water perennials as this encourages their roots to the surface. You want them to dig down to the water below. By August, you may need to start clipping lavender, rosemary and santalina when flowers are over.
4. Feed herbaceous perennials.
5. **VEG:** Sow maincrop carrots, early peas, spring cabbage, lettuce, radishes, endive, chicory. Keep everything well watered. Feed tomatoes every two weeks or so.
6. **GREENHOUSE:** Water and feed. Keep well ventilated. Prick out winter/spring bedding and seedlings of plants sown earlier for winter-flowering pots. By late August, take softwood cuttings of pelargoniums, fuchsias and other frost-tender plants to overwinter.
7. **HEDGES:** By late August, start to consider clipping beech, hornbeam, Leyland or thuja hedges.
8. **SPRING BULBS:** August is the time to get the catalogues out and plan your order! I use Parkers Bulbs (wholesale) or Peter Knysen. I often look through Sarah Raven's wonderful photographs for inspiration but tend to buy cheaper elsewhere!

SLUGS/SNAILS/BLACK & WHITEFLY: I've avoided all pellets and sprays this year. My roses were covered with whitefly but I put on the gloves (most of the time!) and squished them gently by hand. Now, June 20th, they've 90% disappeared without any chemical help (end of their lifecycle???)

Slugs and snails are still a nuisance in the garden and have eaten all my baby tobacco plants but I kept back a few which are now larger and stronger and will go in this week. Fingers crossed. The hostas in the pots are untouched this year due to the sticky copper tape I've put around the tops. Well worth the £5.00.

I might be imagining things but there seem to be far more birds around in my garden too ... no doubt helped by my three new bird-feeders which constantly need filling. Wish they'd eat the juicy slugs, snails and whitefly though!


