Looking for a challenge? Join the next Stars Appeal trek



After four successful fundraising treks, the Stars Appeal have announced their fifth trek. This time the destination is Colombia, to trek through rainforest-clad mountains to the Lost City. The departure date is Saturday 20 April 2024.

The Stars Appeal say their treks are tough, but fun. As one recent trekker said, "I definitely feel I earned every penny of my fundraising and I was so happy to do it." The Lost City trek journeys along steep and muddy trails, through lush jungle and river valleys, to explore the 1,500-year-old Lost City of Teyuna. The trek is organised by Discover Adventure, experts in fundraising challenges, who ran the previous Stars Appeal treks to the Grand Canyon, Machu Picchu, Great Wall of China and Petra. The trek promises highlights, including challenging walking, fabulous scenery and wildlife, and sociable evenings in camp, as well as building bonds with fellow trekkers who are all committed to raising funds for the Stars Appeal.

But there's no doubt there will be challenges too – hot and humid conditions, with rain probable, walking up to 12 hours a day, with around 3500m of ascent and descent before climbing the 1200 steps to the Lost City.

Fundraising from this trek will go towards the £1 million the Stars Appeal needs to raise each year to enhance care for patients across all Wards and Departments at Salisbury District Hospital and support the NHS staff who care for them. The previous treks, involving more than 100 local people, together raised over £400,000 for Stars Appeal projects.

If all that sounds appealing, then you can find out more this September. The Stars Appeal will share all the details about the trek, training and fundraising, as well as the latest on the work of the Stars Appeal, at their Trek Information Evening in central Salisbury on Wednesday 28 September.

Walk for Wards



Walkers return to Wilton House to Walk for Wards in massive numbers

Around 1,700 people stepped forward as the Stars Appeal Walk for Wards returned to Wilton House yesterday (Sunday 3rd July), raising an estimated £90,000 for Salisbury District Hospital's Charity. It was the first time in three years the walk has been held at Wilton House after the last two events had to take place virtually due to Covid 19.

In perfect walking weather, Lord Pembroke, President of the Stars Appeal, welcomed the crowd to his home before handing over to Salisbury District Hospital Chief Executive Stacey Hunter who gave examples of how the charity helps local people being treated at the Hospital and the NHS staff who care for them. A poignant moment of silence was held after which Greatest Hits radio presenter Martin Starke led a countdown and Lord Pembroke, Stacey Hunter and David Newton from main sponsor Salisbury Reds were joined by Stars Appeal Ambassadors to cut the ribbon to get the walk underway.

Lots of walkers were taking part in the annual event to thank the hospital for the care that they, or a loved one, has received or to dedicate their walk in memory of a friend, parent, sibling or child. Many wore signs on their backs detailing the reasons they were taking part and the ward or department at the Hospital they were raising funds for. Participants in the walk chose to walk either a 10k, 5k or 3k. All routes were marshalled by a team led by the Rotary Club of Wilton.

Gemma Heath of the Stars Appeal who organises Walk for Wards said: "It was wonderful to see everyone back at Wilton House after three years away. We were so touched that so many people came out to support their local Hospital charity and that they had such special reasons for doing so. The walk is a team effort and we'd like to say a huge thank you to everyone who worked so hard to make it possible: our hosts Lord and Lady Pembroke and the Wilton Estate team, our principal sponsors Salisbury Reds, our marshals led by the Rotary Club of Wilton, our volunteers, and especially to all the walkers and everyone who sponsored them, the money they have raised will change lives.

22/074 Public Question Time

Mr Phil King of East Chisenbury wished to know what progress had been made on the points raised at the March meeting regarding speeding in East Chisenbury. The main aspect of this was the Wiltshire Council (WC) survey of speeds recorded between East Chisenbury and Enford, then continuing south from Enford to Coombe/Fifield. Due to a backlog in their system (WC's), we understand that the survey has not yet taken place but is anticipated. Cllr Coulthard made the point that a reduced speed zone would be based on the confirmation that traffic travelled at that reduced speed and not (as would be expected) that traffic regularly exceeded that speed. Another point raised was the re-location of the Parish Council's own 3 x '20 mph' signs purchased and installed prior to the grant of the Enford 20MPH zone. If suitable private sites can be identified to display these the PC has no objection to these being relocated to East Chisenbury. Two further points were raised on the re-location of the Speed Indicator Device (SID) however these matters are for Community Speedwatch (CSW) to discuss with the Police rather than the PC. The PC is happy to defer to the Community Speed Watch on all matters relating to the siting of the SID.

22/075 Police Matters and Neighbourhood Watch

There was no Police presence. Cllr Clark had sent in highlights from the Neighbourhood Watch website www.wiltshirenhw.org.uk. regarding fly-tipping, courier fraud and a new British sign language App which has been launched. Fly-tipping. It is now easier to report fly-tipping, which is a criminal offence, at https://www.gov.uk/report-flytipping or you could go directly to WC using the MyWilts app.

<u>Courier Fraud</u>, where fraudsters impersonate the victim's bank or police. 6 main signs to spot Courier Fraud are:

- (1) calls claiming to be the bank
- (2) sudden claims of suspicious banking activity
- (3) being asked for a PIN number or password
- (4) Requests for bank card or cash as evidence
- (5) Victims forced to purchase high-end jewellery or goods
- (6) 'couriers' sent to collect card, cash or bank details.

If you or someone you know has experienced any of the above you should report it to <u>Action Fraud</u> on 0300 123 2040 or via their website at www.actionfraud.police.uk.

22/077 Unitary Council Matters

W.Cllr Ian Blair-Pilling reported on a few local matters as well as WC actions. a.Planning Application no: PL/2022/03669 – Remodelling of existing Parking with Garage and holiday let beneath. This application has been denied.

- b.Fires on the impact zone. Concern was expressed regarding the balance between the military necessity to train and the impact of the consequent fires on the local population. It was also felt that recent restriction on grazing the impact area grasslands had exacerbated the severity of the fires.
- c. Cost of Living Crisis. W.Cllr Blair-Pilling said that whilst the Government are running the larger schemes/projects nationwide, WC can administer that

assistance locally. WC themselves no longer have the reserves to help everyone and therefore they are targeting those who are absolutely desperate and in immediate need.

d.The Highways Dept had an underspend last year, most of which will go into the county's reserve fund however some of this will be retained for highways related work such as road markings, gully emptying and buying another vehicle to increase their (gulley emptying) ability across the county. The Council is also considering taking on 3 or 4 staff to help deal with and clamp down on Fly-tipping.

22/080 Matters Arising

New litter bin for Coombe end of footpath to Fifield – The Clerk confirmed this had been ordered and would be installed as soon as possible.

Defibrillator Training session – The Clerk had tried to contact the Community Heartbeat Trust (who had supplied the current defibrillator) to organise another Training evening. Emails requesting this of 20th June and 4th July have not been answered. South West Ambulance Services (SWAS) with whom the Defibrillator is registered, no longer offer training sessions unless they have supplied the equipment however a guide price of £475 for an evening with 10-25 people has been obtained although this may be out of date pricing. The Clerk will continue to try and find a provider and arrange a date.

Salt and grit bins – WC are requesting orders now for salt and grit for the Parishes which will be available for collection in October/November time. The Clerk has checked the levels in the bins and Cllr Young will check the levels in storage and get back to the Clerk with any quantity to be ordered.

LJS Garden Services – who maintain the Memorial Garden and the Playpark for the Parish have reported they will be taking the company in a different direction and have therefore resigned their contract from the end of July. The Clerk has spoken to KC Outdoor Services who will take up the contract at the same prices from the beginning of August. They have the equipment and knowledge of the work required as well as the correct Licences etc for disposal of gardening waste and will be happy to take on the continuity of service to the Parish Council.

22/081 Resident's issues Raised.

A query has been raised by a resident as to why there is half a lamppost on the Coombe/Fifield footpath. Added to the curiosity of this is the fact that there is no identification number on it. Cllr Hiskett has said he will look into this matter with WC as he looks after the Public Rights of Way in the Parish.

SID, new position and solar panels – This was covered as part of a wider discussion held during Public Questions (see above 22/074).

22/086 Roads and Highways

Cllr Coulthard reported that he has met and started working with the new Parish Steward, Kevan. He is very thorough and professional in his approach. As a reminder to all residents, if you wish to report Highways matters that need attention in the Parish, please contact Cllr Rob Coulthard who will add the requirement to the list of jobs for the Parish Steward's next visit.

22/089 Any Other Business

A question was raised as to the situation on the site of the old Mink Farm. The current owner had lost his appeal to remain on site and had a period of time to remove the living abilities on site. W.Cllr lan Blair-Pilling will be contacted in the first instance as the property covers the Enford, Netheravon and Fittleton parishes.



PCC Philip Wilkinson:

You will already be aware the police force watchdog HMICFRS has placed Wiltshire Police into 'special measures' as a result of its performance.

The Inspectorate's report is a sobering read and is highly disappointing, as I know it will to our county's residents. It's especially disheartening because I know Wiltshire Police has many dedicated officers, staff and volunteers, working hard to deliver a quality, efficient, frontline

But this report makes it clear - there are areas of concern Wiltshire Police need to address: victims of crime, vulnerable people and our communities deserve better. You had told me this in volume when I was on your doorstep and the results of my countywide survey and consultation only confirmed this, as well as from local councillors and MPs, on the policing

consultation only confirmed unis, as well as non-service they were getting.

It was fortunate those areas highlighted by the Inspectorate's report had already been picked up as part of my own strategic assessments of the Force and it meant this shaped my Police and Crime Plan and influenced the robust and challenging scrutiny sessions I hold with the Chief Constable from the outset.

We now have a police and crime plan which ensures Wiltshire Police will meet and deliver

We now have a police and crime plan which ensures Wiltshire Police will meet and deliver those priorities influenced by you, focused on delivering a service the public want and prioritising those crimes that matter most to communities. My role as PCC is to scrutinise the policing service provided, to challenge where I see performance issues and then support the Chief Constable and Force to implement change and

improve in times like these.

Improve in times like these.

The necessary remedial measures needed to make the improvements highlighted in the report are already in progress and my immediate priority is to ensure that Wiltshire's Chief Constable, and his senior leadership team, move with focus and speed, particularly in the Force's response to the public and to vulnerable people and victims, in dramatically improving performance and the quality and effectiveness of investigations.

My aim, alongside the Chief Constable, is for Wiltshire Police to prioritise those crimes which matter most to communities so we can satisfy the Inspectorate but, more importantly, we can satisfy you as residents.

Working together, the Chief Constable and I have already agreed on a back-to-basics reset for the Force so I can assure you the process of change is already progressing. I expect to see a tangible change in service delivery and the Chief Constable has reassured me the necessary changes are in place. I will be receiving regular progress reports from him, and his senior leadership team, to ensure those remedial actions are completed as soon as

Thankfully many residents do not need to use our policing service frequently but when they do, the service they receive should be a quality, frontline, response. I will continue to ask for those assurances on behalf of Wiltshire's residents and ensure Wiltshire Police is delivering on behalf of all of the communities it serves.
