

Recipe of the month

BLACK PUDDING & APPLE SAUSAGE ROLLS

Makes 16 small ones - ideal Christmas canapés!!

Even if you think you don't like black pudding, try these!!!

200g black pudding, crumbled

400g/1 pack pork & apple sausages

Couple of sprigs of thyme, leaves only
Generous grating of nutmeg

1 crunchy apple peeled & finely chopped

1 roll of puff pastry

1 egg, beaten 2 tsp sesame seeds




Slit the sausages and remove from their casing and put them into a mixing bowl with the crumbled black pudding, apple, nutmeg and some pepper. I don't salt because of the black pudding. Mix together with your hands.

Unroll the pastry and cut it in half lengthways. Divide the filling into two and squeeze together to form a thin sausage down each, right up to the ends.

Brush beaten egg along the seams and roll up, sealing the edges. Turn over and brush with beaten egg and sprinkle with sesame seeds. Divide each roll into 8. Put onto a baking sheet with space between each.

Put in a pre-heated oven 200C/Gas 6 cook for 10-15 minutes. May need to turn the tray around mid-way to ensure even browning. They can be frozen and re-heated. They are really good!!!




Chisenbury Fishing Syndicate; River Avon Information

The UK has 90% of the world's chalk streams, (rivers formed by rain falling on chalk downlands) to be filtered over months, even years, before emerging through springs to create rivers. Traditionally this produces a consistent flow of pure water at an even temperature; ideal conditions for plants and animals to thrive.

However, there is invisible pollution, a cocktail of chemicals reaching our rivers that has not been fully researched but is having a noticeable effect. The Chisenbury Fishing Syndicate, regularly sample invertebrate life in the river and our results show a continual decline over the years. Some may feel that a decline in fly life is a good thing, drivers' windscreens are clearer, but these creatures are an essential part of the web of life and their absence leaves animals and birds having to work harder to find food.

We carry out monthly water quality monitoring, focusing on phosphates and nitrates in the water. Results regularly show that nitrate levels are only just below an acceptable 5 parts per million, whilst phosphates are consistently above the normal range. Our part of the River Avon has a healthy population of wild Brown Trout and Grayling; our target species, but there are also Minnows, Bullheads, Sticklebacks, Stone Loach, Eels and Pike. Grayling, in particular, are a species that like abundant pure water, and in the thirty years that I have fished at Chisenbury there has been a consistent decline in their numbers, most notably in recent years. In an effort to counteract this, landlords, the Defence Infrastructure Organisation, asked Wiltshire Wildlife Trust to look at the problem.

Pioneering River Restoration Project In Chisenbury



A ground-breaking, Defence Infrastructure Organisation funded project is restoring an area of wetland on the River Avon in West Chisenbury; the project is to enhance the biodiversity of the local area by improving the watercourse and natural floodplain, and so off-setting nutrient pollution.

It has restored a 400-metre stretch of the river Avon by putting the river back into the centre of the floodplain along a new channel.

Secondary channels have been created to connect wetlands and ponds establishing wildlife habitats across the river's floodplain. As well as boosting biodiversity, these new areas of wetland will help to capture nutrient-loaded sediment and carbon.

The restoration will see new wetland habitats retain water all-year-round, meaning native plants will flourish and wildlife thrive. Improved wetland will increase habitat diversity and will bring a host of benefits for many species found locally. The new river channels will include re-profiled gravel 'riffles', creating diversity in the river channels and provide the perfect habitat for spawning fish such as the wild brown trout.

Tips to help prevent burglars from targeting the outside of your home

Every home is different, there isn't a one size fits all approach but these tips will help point you in the right direction.



Visible and audible security deterrents (e.g. outdoor camera, video doorbell and outdoor sirens)



Keep valuables out of sight of the windows and away from doors



Light up your porch and garden (e.g. motion or flood light)



Plant spiky shrubs around the border of your property such as Holly, Pyracantha and Hawthorn



your fence. It's a type of non-drying paint that can stay slippery for years, preventing trespassers from being able to climb a surface without fallling down.

Apply anti-climb paint to the top of

*This could potentially cause injuries from falling, you should install a warning sign.



Fences, gates, driveway gates etc. add an extra hurdle for intruders to tackle



Keep ladders, boxes, bins and other items out of sight which could be used to help scale a fence or house



Make it appear as if someone is home with indoor lights on a timer and tilt blinds



Keep outdoor tools locked away as these could help a burglar break in



Gravel driveways and paths makes it harder for intruders to tread quietly with stones underfoot



Barking dogs - although we do think dogs deserve a break from their guard duties

Abridged Draft Minutes of the meeting of 7th November 2023

23/093 Police Matters and Neighbourhood Watch. PC Mike Handscomb was unable to attend and sent his apologies. Cllr Clark sent a Neighbourhood Watch report:

Neighbourhood Watch are also raising awareness of child exploitation, and how to spot and report it. This is through The Children's Society and their hashtag LookCloser campaign. Cllr Roberts raised the matter of the dead hares, caught by coursers, deliberately left in a line in the middle of Water Lane. The incident was reported to the Police who had been trying to catch the coursers 'in the act'. However this is a very difficult task covering many square miles of the Plain both off-track and at night. Leaving them on public display was an act of defiance on their part.

23/095 Unitary Council Matters W.Cllr Ian Blair-Pilling reported: The Local Plan Consultation period was still open for the public until 22nd November. Everyone is welcome to attend. Cllr Roberts reported that both he and the Clerk had attended the more concise presentation created and given by WCllrs Ian Blair-Pilling and Graham Wright. This was specifically finetuned to the potential housing requirements in our local areas. Full information can be found on Wiltshire Council's website.

- **ii. Wiltshire Connect bus service.** This is only a pilot scheme, funded by central Govt, it is proving to be very popular. The main idea is to give rural villages better connections to each other as well as local towns and cities. For further information, the App and timetables go to https://www.connectingwiltshire.co.uk/getting-around/bus/wiltshire-connect/.
- **iii.** The proposed speed limit reduction on the A345 (50mph down to 40mph) from the top of the hill at the north end of Netheravon down to the turning by the Dog and Gun is being installed with new 40mph speed signs and to date, one new Speed Indicator Device (SID). There are plans to install a further SID on this stretch of road in due course. The Speedwatch team are already 'patrolling' the area.
- iv. Planning Application PL/2023/08214. Conversion of Barn to a holiday let in Fifield. The public consultation period on this application is now closed although any late letters (for or against) will still be seen by the Planning Officer (PO). WCllr Blair-Pilling reported that he had been in touch with the PO who has already written to the applicant's Agent to say there are a few queries about this application and asking if they would like to withdraw it and address the current concerns. Whilst there is no further news on this, WCllr Blair-Pilling has said it will be 'called in' for a more thorough and detailed study by the Planning Office.
- v. Enford bridge. There are concerns about the look and safety of Enford Bridge which was damaged by a car in September. WC sent an inspector to the site who will have reported back on the severity and safety issues. WCllr Blair-Pilling confirmed 3 stanchions had been broken and due to the age of the bridge, new stanchions will have to be refabricated. WC looks after over 1,000 bridges in the county and as this is still in a safe and serviceable condition, he thought there would be no action taken until the new year, possibly early to mid-year.

23/098 Matters Arising

Local Plan. This item was covered above. **Playpark inspection.** This was in September and the report circulated to all Councillors. Most of the comments made by the inspector were rated low risk with one or two as medium risks e.g. weeds on the surface around the basketball hoop, a bolt cover missing, no 'ownership' signage, some rust appearing and a D-ring needing to be replaced. Cllrs Roberts, Hiskett and Farrow have all spent time in the Playpark renovating and repairing where they can. The Clerk has been asked to contact manufacturers to assist with these repairs. Cllr Waight has offered to help with any welding and Cllrs Young, Roberts, Hiskett and Waight will meet on site on Monday 13th to discuss and plan further.

D-Day 80th Anniversary – **6th June 2024.** Cllr Waight has confirmed that he has permission to have a bonfire at the top of B Crossing - also that he may not be available to oversee the bonfire however one of his sons or another responsible resident may be able to. A discussion was had as to food for the occasion. The BBQs at the recent Fireworks event were mentioned. It was agreed the Community Fund could be approached if a possible link between the D-Day celebrations and the Village Fete might work. Cllr Roberts will raise this.

Parish Emergency Assistance Scheme (PEAS).This is for emergency use only as it is the Householder's responsibility to organise their own flood protection. There is a public meeting in Shrewton Village Hall (SP3 4JX) on 30th November run by Dorset & Wiltshire Fire & Rescue, the Environment Agency and WC and anyone wishing to attend should register with them – you can do so here floodwessex@environment-agency.gov.uk.

Remembrance Day. Cllrs Roberts, Hiskett and Cliffe-Roberts put up the poppies around the Church area after the recent storm. Cllr Pat Holdway has agreed to lay the wreath on behalf of the Parish Council for the village at the service on Sunday 12th November at 9 o'clock. It is hoped another Cllr may do a reading at the Service.

Christmas Tree and lighting, carols – Friday, December 8th **at 6.00pm.** As in previous years it was agreed to hold a small celebration to turn on the Christmas tree lights. It is a small but happy event with a welcoming Public House to retire to afterwards!

23/103 Parish Hall Cllr Cliffe-Roberts was unable to attend and sent in his report:

On 11 October a working party (Bruce Waight, Richard Roberts, Tom Hunter, Clive Bullen and myself) laid the access path to complete the laying out of the Coronation Garden. David Spencer has planted a number of shrubs in the garden itself, with hedging along the road boundary. Huge thanks to all concerned in bringing this project to a conclusion.

/The "History Board" has been printed and I am currently working on a stand so that it can be added to the garden soon. This completes the conversion of the Parish Hall site into a public garden and car parking, all for the benefit of and as requested by the Villagers.
