
CHARADE

A farewell to The Swan

The biblical floods this month reminded us of our first 'official' viewing of The Swan 10 years ago when flood waters were up to the first step of the path towards the pub and all the springs in Water Lane had blown. Of course, we already knew the pub well as we'd lived in the village for 11 years and knew that this wasn't a 'usual' event.

Needless to say, it didn't put us off and we've had almost 10, very happy, years at The Swan. Many, if not all, will know that we have decided that our time at The Swan has come to an end. It's not been a decision we've come to lightly but, as we have not one single day together off and the hours it takes to run it often number in the high 70s each week, we have decided it's time to rethink things and search out a different life. We can't say 'better life' as we've had the best times at The Swan, it'll just be a different one.

New Year's Eve in the pub was just like the old times, pre-COVID. It was packed, people were letting their hair down, staff joining in the party and people popping in for a pint or two and many staying until the bitter end. It's fair to say that since COVID and the state of the economy since then has changed the business; energy prices tripled for us with no cap on rises for businesses, this just felt overwhelming. Compromising on quality; the homemade pies, the quality of fish or meat, doesn't reflect how we operate yet we find their costs have gone up. Charging over the odds for these simple things, just to make a profit, is not where we're happy operating.

We know what a privilege it is to be part of someone's big life event; we've catered for weddings of villagers and those further afield. We've shared the losses of family and friends through wakes and respectful gatherings and we've celebrated christenings and birthdays, achievements and commiserations. We have been able to get to know more people in the village and beyond than we ever thought possible and in doing so, been award winning - best rural pub in the country in 2018 was a highlight. However, it's also about the quiet moments too – welcoming someone new to the village, being the first people they talk to, having a giggle over the bar, a catch up on a Friday night.

We've achieved much since we moved in, many of things tangible: New thatch, re-facing the walls with traditional cob not cement, redoing the toilets, installing a new kitchen, remodelling the back garden and top garden, working with local craftspeople to design bar shelving or reserved signs; we know that by closing, we also close the door temporarily for those small businesses we've championed and hope that when the pub reopens, the new landlords will value these things as much as we've done.

What is the future of The Swan? Well, it's on the market, we're working with the shareholders to find a new landlord although, this probably won't be a quick process as the market is not moving quickly. We will still be around to keep the pub together and tidy and Iris and her team from hub in the pub have been working hard to find an alternative venue so that villagers can still meet up. There is a great determination that the pub remains a pub – it's all it has ever been – and once again takes a vital place in village life.

We've seen over 120 staff work for us over the time we've been at The Swan; many of them teenagers taking their first job or taking their first step on the career ladder. Heck, there's even been a Swan marriage (congratulations George & Carol) and subsequent babies (again, well done George and Carol). We've been enormously lucky to have really great staff who muck in and work so hard to provide for all of us. Sean who lives in the village has worked for us since he was 14 and is now about the leave University! Jemma began with us when she was 19 and has been a vital 'right hand woman' to ensure The Swan is what it is – she's taken to cooking alongside Pete as well as managing the bar like a duck to water and we know she'll go on to great things. Sam, as our very first employee also rejoined us for the last 4 months and it's been great having her back. We hope you join us in thanking all of them over the years for their support, good service and good humour in working alongside us!

There are quite simply too many other people to thank individually – from those who've offered advice and acted on it, to those who have mucked in and help set up various things to those who've offered words of support, used us throughout COVID even though they hadn't previously engaged with the pub and many, many others. Thank you one and all.

And to you; whether you've had just one glass of orange juice in the pub or been a regular throughout the years, we thank you. YOU are what makes the pub a viable, busy, lovely place. If you haven't visited the pub, we urge you to do so under the next landlords as you are what will keep this important asset in our village.

Thank you – we've had the best times and look forward to sharing many more with you in the future, just from the other side of the bar!

Enford's Great Bustards - Tim Edwards

Many villagers will be aware that the edges of our Parish are home to one of Britain's rarest, and most remarkable, bird species — the Great Bustard. Mature birds stand around a metre tall, and the male ranks amongst the heaviest of all flying birds in world, at 15-20kg. They can live up to 20 years, but are slow to reproduce, with females only raising at most one chick a year. Large, and sometimes aggressive when cornered, a mature Great Bustard is able to defend themself even against foxes.



Sadly, the species was rendered extinct as a resident breeding bird in Britain during the 1830s, following a long decline. Although some were shot as trophies and for the pot, we suspect that habitat change was the core reason for their demise. Improved agricultural methods, including the seed drill and horse hoe caused an intensification of human activity on the arable fields that had been their nesting areas, this was further exacerbated by increasing enclosure of fields during the late 18th

century. After the 1830s there were occasional sightings of individuals or small groups (known as 'droves'), but these are highly likely to represent vagrant birds from Europe, which tended to arrive in search of fodder during hard continental winters.

There were minor attempts to reintroduce birds during the Edwardian times and a captive breeding program ran at Porton Down in the 1970s and 80s, which was unsuccessful.

In 1998 the Great Bustard Group was established as a charity, with the stated aim of reintroducing the species.

The first releases took place in 2004, with juvenile birds rescued from Southern Russia. In 2012 the project shifted its focus to using Spanish birds, a closer match genetically to our old English Great Bustards. These were imported as eggs, rather than as juveniles and survival rates increased significantly. The last import of birds took place in 2019, when it was felt that enough birds had been released to form a viable population, especially with encouraging evidence of breeding and nesting.



The project is not Government funded, so relies on fundraising activities in order to lease habitat and fund the monitoring and conservation. We have Open Days at Enford Village Hall planned for 7th and 8th September, details of these will follow in due course.



The March lecture of The Arts Society - Pewsey Vale, will be held on Tuesday 5th March at 2.30pm in the Bouverie Hall. This month we will hear from Lynne Gibson on "Alchemy and Adventure: A History of **Exotic Colours and Poisonous Pigments".**

In our modern world it's easy to take colour for granted. Yet before organic chemistry the most desirable pigments were exotic or poisonous. Merchants supplied pungent yellow 'purree' nuggets from India, cochineal 'grana' from the holds of Spanish galleons, lapis rock carried by camel train from the mountains of Badakhshan. Alchemists prepared deadly 'King's Yellow' and 'ruby of arsenic'. 'Moorish Gold' was concocted, * according to a 12th century monk, from basilisk powder ground with * human blood! Small wonder artists kept their paint recipes closely ※ guarded in Books of Secrets.

Lynne Gibson has worked as an independent art historian for the past ten years. Prior to that she lectured in art history at Bristol and Sussex universities, taught in schools and sixth form colleges and ran painting, drawing and printmaking courses in art colleges. She has also worked professionally as an etcher and a painter in oils, exhibiting in the British Museum, the Guild Gallery in Bristol and the Barbican in London.

SLOW ROAST LEG OF LAMB WITH A HERB RUB

Tender, slow-roasted lamb, infused with garlic and herb flavours makes wonderful comfort food. This recipe makes its own delicious gravy; perfect for a big meal with friends and family. Easter is the

next big event in the calendar so why not consider this delicious recipe



INGREDIENTS:

Whole head of garlic 1 tbsp salt flakes

Olive oil

2 sprigs thyme, leaves only

2 chopped sprigs rosemary, leaves only

1 leg of lamb, approximately 2kg/4.5lb.

METHOD:

Preheat the oven to 160C/325F/Gas 3

Peel and crush the garlic cloves, with the salt in a pestle and mortar, enough salt to give the mixture some 'grit'. Mash the garlic into the salt. Add the rosemary and thyme, mix with enough olive oil to form a thick paste.

Rub the garlic mixture over the whole surface of the lamb. Place it in a deep sided roasting tin with 250ml/9fl oz of water. Baste the meat with the liquid then cover the lamb with foil. Place in the oven for 3-3.5 hours, until cooked.

When cooked, pour off any excess oil from the liquid, leaving the cloudy, herby sediment in place. This is the gravy. Cover the pan with a lid and rest for 15 minutes.

Carve the lamb into thick chunks and serve with mashed potatoes. Pour over cooking juices.

Police and Crime Commissioner: Philip Wilkinson

After a period of public consultation, I presented my final proposal for the policing precept of your council tax to the Police and Crime Panel this month. Wiltshire Police is facing increased financial pressures as we strive to deliver the necessary service improvements required, which led to the panel supporting my decision to increase the precept by 5.2%, £1.09 a month or £13 a year for the average Band D property. The decision to increase the precept has been a difficult but necessary one. I am listening to residents when they tell me that they want an improved service from both the police and criminal justice system. The public voted in favour of the rise, with 85% of respondents to saying they wanted to see more investment in policing. Whilst key improvements have been delivered over past 12 months, there is still much to do to make Wiltshire safer.

Even with the precept rise, we still need to make savings of £2.4m to cover the funding gap. We remain one of the worst funded force areas in the country, but I will continue to lobby the government for fairer funding.

Both the Chief Constable and I are committed to delivering a policing service which meets an ever-changing crime picture and is fit for the future. I am confident that with this increase we can continue to invest in key areas to maintain the improvements that we are now seeing across the board.


