Enford Church: May 2024

We wanted to write to the whole village to bring your attention to the fact that, along with many Churches, we are facing challenging times raising enough funds for the upkeep of our community Church.

We are sure that we would all agree that the Church - along with other features of the village - is a very important part of what makes us want to live here. There is of course a lot of history - the Church was built in the 13<sup>th</sup> Century - and has been a focal point for previous generations including during the World Wars. It has been important for many, for weddings, for baptisms, funerals, Christmas, Easter and Harvest services. While many of us may not be regular Church-goers, I think we all recognise that the Church represents something special within our village community: it is a stunning building in a remarkably beautiful setting.



The sad fact is current weekly Church service collections and other income streams are insufficient to sustain its upkeep. Many of you will be aware, for example, that last year we had to have significant repair work done on the ceiling and now face having to fund additional infrastructure work identified by the surveyor. Paying for these essential repairs as well as having the grounds mown and the Church insured etc, has to come from money that we raise ourselves. To support our efforts, many people within the village have given financially, and of their time, to fund raise in different ways: inviting and participating in the Pewsey Choir, baking for the Christmas Fayre. Despite these efforts we are struggling...and the future is looking bleak.

We are very conscious that we are in the middle of a cost-of-living crisis but if individually and collectively we find ways to contribute small amounts, we could help to sustain the Church as a centre for our community into the future. At present there are some 20-30 regular givers to the Church; We hope that we can significantly increase this number. We are asking you to consider giving £10, £20 or £30 monthly or whatever you feel able, to help preserve our Church. We can claim 25% back in Gift Aid if you are a tax-payer. #### "Off the Record: Album Cover Art 1950 - 2000".

The speaker is Rupert Dickens.

Some of the most iconic images of the 20th century were created, not for galleries, or private patrons, but for record sleeves. The zebra crossing immortalised on the cover of the Beatles' "Abbey Road" album has become a place of pilgrimage. This talk will explore the art of the album cover and reveal the connections between visual and musical creativity, in this period of popular culture. Album covers have been designed by Andy Warhol, Peter Blake, Yoko Ono and a host of other artists and designers.

Rupert Dickens is an art historian with an interest in European 16th and 17th century painting. An accredited lecturer for The Arts Society and works at the Wallace Collection as a guide, conducting tours and lecturing on aspects of the collection. He also accompanies groups on art-themed tours.

## Local live crime.

A concerning number of frauds are happening around Salisbury and the surrounding villages. The last reported contact was14<sup>th</sup> May 2024, where multiple people were contacted and 1 victim gave £3,000 to the fraudsters The scam is as follows: Scammers posing as police officers and bank officials cold call residents and trick them into handing over thousands of pounds – after spending hours duping them over the phone.

The scammers ask the victims to call them back via 999. However they will still be on the line, but the victims believe they are talking to the police. This is the main hook the fraudsters use throughout the scam. People are encouraged to speak to vulnerable relatives and neighbours about courier fraud following a spate of incidents in recent weeks, including one case where an elderly male was told to withdraw a large amount of Euros from various cash machines, nearly £20,000.

Courier fraud comes in many forms, usually it involves fraudsters telephoning a potential victim, claiming to be from their bank, the police, or another law enforcement authority.

The most common forms of courier fraud are:

1) Bank card expiry: Fraudsters claim to be from the victim's bank and say their card is no longer valid. They ask for the pin number and then send a "courier" to collect the card before using it for fraudulent purposes. Purchasing high end items:

The suspects pretend to be police officers and ask the victim to help with an undercover operation, purchasing expensive items; watches, jewellery gold or Euros. Once the item is bought, the victim hands the item to the criminal.

2) Counterfeit cash/bank investigation: Someone claiming to be police or banking official informs the victim they need help with a banking corruption investigation. The victim is asked to withdraw a large amount of money and the cash is picked up by a courier to "check for fingerprints or to identify counterfeit bank notes". Alternatively, the victim may be asked to package the cash up and send it by post to an address provided by the fraudster.

3) Computer takeover: The fraudster telephones the victim, pretending to be their internet service provider, saying there's have had an issue with their internet connectivity, and are due compensation. Then the victim is persuaded to download a remote access application, giving the suspect access to their home computers. The fraudster persuades the victims that they have been paid too much compensation and the victims withdraw cash to pay the money back, which is collected by a courier.

#### Please remember that:

• Police officers, Police staff, banks and other organisations such as HMRC will never call people in this way and ask you to withdraw money or disclose personal or financial information. If someone does do this, please hang up – it will be a scam.

• If someone calls claiming to be a police officer, ask for their ID number and police force. Wait at least five minutes. Do not use any number they provide unless you can confirm it is genuine. Ensure the call has disconnected as scammers will often leave the line open or use another phone.

A genuine police officer will not mind waiting while you check their identity (it's a sign that it is a scam if the person becomes pushy or stresses urgency).

• Take a step back from everything and take a few moments to think. Speak to a trusted friend or relative for their opinion before agreeing to anything. The fraudster's tactic is often to keep the victim busy talking and isolated and stress that they should not tell anyone about the call.

• Neither your bank nor the police will send a courier to your home to collect cash, bank cards, PINs or other valuable goods.

• If you are a friend, relative or carer of someone you think might be vulnerable to this type of scam, please speak to them about this advice. You might be the only person who can stop them from being scammed. If you or someone you know has been a victim of fraud, report it to us by calling 101. If a crime is in progress, dial 999.

This is an open meeting and all residents are welcome to attend with the main item of discussion being the closure of the existing charity scheme and the transfer of all assets to Enford Parish Council who are the existing Guardian Trustees.

## Recipe of the Month

## Spicy Sausages with Peppers & Beans

1 large Onion chopped2 Cloves of garlic chopped1 jar roasted red peppers (350g drained weight)2 tsp fennel seeds1 tsp smoked paprika2 tsp fennel seeds1 tsp smoked paprikaPinch of saffronPinch of chilli flakes200ml white wine12 sausages (chorizo style)Tomato puree (2 tbsp)Juice of 1 lemon2 x 400g cannellini beans/butter beans (*drained + rinsed*)Crème fraiche/yoghurtChopped parsley (to serve)

Preheat the oven to Gas 6/200C

Lay the sausages out in a lined baking tray, put in the oven for 15-20 minutes, you brown **one** side so don't turn them. Put a glug of olive oil in an oven proof dish to fry the onion and garlic gently for 5-10 minutes, until starting to soften. Drain the jar of red peppers and slice roughly. Put these with the onion and add the fennel seeds, paprika and chilli flakes. Pour in the wine and saffron and let it come to a simmer. Add the beans along with half a tin of water. Season with salt and pepper and bring back to a simmer. Take the sausages out of the oven and lay them on top of the beans, brown side **down;** you brown the paler side now).

Put back into the oven for 20 minutes until the sausages are brown and the sauce bubbling. Taste, add lemon if needed. Serve with a dollop of yoghurt and scatter some parsley over the top.

All you need is a good salad and, if diet permits, hot crusty bread!



#### ENFORD PARISH COUNCIL Draft Minutes of the meeting of 7<sup>th</sup> May 2024

**24/038 Police Matters and Neighbourhood Watch.** The latest Police Report had been sent to all Councillors on 30<sup>th</sup> April. Cllr Clark noted that a vehicle had been broken into, nothing had been stolen in the Village Hall carpark. She also reported from the Neighbourhood Watch aspect, a focus on securing your property when going away and a rise in 'hate' articles.

Cllr Waight said that there was still a lot of hare coursing on the Plain but as the crops are growing, it is reducing slightly. Cllr Roberts was pleased to inform the Council that Philip Wilkinson had been re-elected Police and Crime Commissioner. **24/040 Unitary Council Matters** WC Blair-Pilling reported that WC's budgets were all balanced. There are no closures of sports facilities or libraries contrary to a report in the Times newspaper. Leisure facilities are not a statutory requirement but WC has managed to maintain their viability and continued public access in Wiltshire. WC has been upset by this report and has written to the authors who had taken their information from an 'inaccurate' source – OffLog. Sadly damage has been done to WC's reputation.

From an Area Board point of view, there will be a Statistics meeting on 30<sup>th</sup> May at Antrobus House in Amesbury. This will cover the statistics (health requirements, schools, age, poverty levels etc) of all communities in the area to try and work out the best method for provision of services.

The next formal Area Board meeting will be held on 13<sup>th</sup> June in Durrington Church Hall at 6.30pm where they will elect a new Chairman etc. Cllr Roberts (as Enford's representative at Area Boards) asked how many meetings there were per year. WC Blair-Pilling said that they currently hold 4 'formal' meetings per year and between those, there are 'subject targeted' meetings on a variety of matters raised by/ affecting individual Parish Councils. These are in person or 'Teams' meetings and no official requirement for a representative.

**Highways.** He reported that WC is doing more background work on and for WC's roads, not just filling potholes. Structural/viability studies and proposals, necessary before any 'visible' work is seen, putting more funds into enforcement and signage. **Flooding**. There is more 'background' work being done on flooding and of all the parishes in his ward, Enford's problems are the worst. Cllr Roberts asked about minutes from the 'roadshow' meeting recently held in Figheldean. WC, Wessex Water & Environment Agency attended and Enford's specific questions were sent in before the meeting which was attended by Cllrs Roberts, Farrow, Waight and Mark Symonds. WCBlair-Pilling said the 'roadshow' meeting was one of 18 held throughout the county. These were for the preparation of maintenance rather than the Local Highway and Footpath Improvement Groups (LFIG) meetings which he would like to make more available to the public. LFIG handles the 'lighter' more 'visible', less engineering side of such work.

Cllrs Roberts and Farrow have been through the parish mapping the drains and gullys at the request of WC. Some of these were so heavily covered in mud that you wouldn't know they were there. WC Blair-Pilling is asking the WC Highways portfolio holder to visit Enford and assess the problems but this may take time.

**24/043** Matters Arising Playpark maintenance update. Clirs Roberts, Hiskett, Waight and Farrow have done the maintenance work at the Playpark. The height of the round swing has been raised to comply with regulations, new D-rings on the swings and all the compliance signage in the Safety Report of September 23, is on display. The Clerk reported a delay in the repair of the Multiplay unit but she was chasing it. It was agreed that Playpark funds should be transferred to the PC bank account in order to pay for this when the job was done.

**D-Day Anniversary 6<sup>th</sup> June.** Cllr Roberts reported that the Enford celebrations had been cancelled for two reasons (1) Key personnel for health and safety would not be available and (2) Netheravon, Haxton and Fittleton are jointly holding a large celebration for the event in the next Parish. It is hoped that by not holding our own event, we do not detract from the larger event. Cllr Young was upset Enford would not be holding its own event and felt it was a lack of respect for the soldiers from Enford (and their families) who had given their lives.

**iv. Burned Barn.** In March it was reported that pieces of cladding from the barn above Water Lane that was set on fire last June had been blown across the public footpath. Due to the age and nature of the building, it was thought possible that these could include Asbestos Containing Material (ACM). The Clerk reported the matter to Landmarc/DIO and asked for confirmation that ACM was not present and for the debris be cleared. Some clearing has been done, but no response given to the query on the presence of ACM. The Clerk has been asked to follow up, requesting the relevant entry on the Asbestos Register. If a satisfactory response is not received an approach to the Health and Safety Executive would be justified.

**New Bin Contractors.** The previous contractor put in a second increase in 18 months, both increases over 100%. This is unacceptable. As of the beginning of May, a new contractor will empty all the bins. They have been shown the locations and completed their first round successfully; hopefully overflowing bins will no longer be a problem. The Clerk was asked to ensure lids are properly replaced.

**24/044 Resident's issues Raised. Grants Road/Water Lane junction.** A complaint was received from a resident about the state of the road surface at the junction of Water Lane and Grants Road. The potholes very bad but also residents are again parking on the pavements, forcing people to walk in the road. Grants Road in not 'adopted' and therefore it is not the responsibility of WC but comes under Aster. Cllrs Roberts and Farrow have inspected the site and the delineation of 'ownership' is back from the junction itself. The problem is the responsibility of Aster and WC. Cllr Farrow has told WC of the problem and the Clerk has written to Aster for a site visit and repairs. Cllr Hibberd said he had reported the problem twice in the last couple of years but neither body has responded.

#### 10k Walk for Wards challenge

A father-of-three who says he is "lucky" to be alive after having a cardiac arrest at work will walk 10km to support the Stars Appeal, Salisbury Hospital's

Charity. Adrian Abbott, from Salisbury, was inspired to take part in the Stars Appeal's Walk for Wards on Sunday, **July 7** at Wilton House by the care he received at Salisbury District Hospital. He will be joined by colleagues from MJ Abbott.

In August 2023, Adrian suffered a cardiac arrest, when the heart suddenly stops beating. He admits: "I was lucky to survive. I was driving a forklift and had a cardiac arrest. I fell out of the forklift and my head landed on concrete. One of my colleagues rushed over and gave me CPR while another fetched a defibrillator." Ambulance crews arrived and rushed Adrian to Salisbury Hospital. "I would never have made it to the hospital without my colleagues. I want to thank them, the hospital staff and the paramedics for saving my life."

In hospital, Adrian benefitted from a range of Stars Appeal funded facilities on the ICU, including state-of-the-art equipment which helps patients with their rehabilitation, independence and recovery, that he describes as being a "five star" facility.

Adrian, who previously took part in Walk for Wards after his twin girls received care on the Hospital's Neonatal Unit, said: "It is very difficult to come into Salisbury Hospital and not be touched by the projects, equipment and facilities funded by the Stars Appeal. I want to raise money for the Stars Appeal as the charity benefits so many people in the local community."
