## Línda Sampson R.I.P ~ Tríbute By Emma Jefferíes

It's rare nowadays for people to still live in the village they were born in, especially somewhere as small as Enford. Linda Sampson was one of those people. She died after a short illness on 12<sup>th</sup> June 2024 and Enford is a poorer place without her and her knowledge of the village and its people. Born to Vi and Fred Elkins, Linda grew up, alongside her cousin Ruth who was like a sister to her, in the small thatched cottage next to The Swan, simply named 'The Cottage'. When reminiscing about her childhood, Linda fondly remembered the carefree nature of the village where she and Ruth lived. She continued to care for her mum until Vi's death in 2013, a loving daughter to the end.

Time does not stand still and Linda met Keith at a friend's wedding in 1968, a young soldier; he introduced her to his mother and she predicted Linda would become his wife, a mother's intuition being paramount, they were smitten! Married on 8<sup>th</sup> August 1970, it was a long and happy marriage. Peppered with tours abroad they lived in Germany and Colchester before settling back in Enford. Keith was posted to Singapore but Linda couldn't bear to leave her parents so remained here whilst he was away.

It's hard to remember a time before Grants Road, Paddock Close and Palmerston Meadow but Linda and Keith were among the first residents of Paddock Close in1974 and remained there ever since. They recalled the rough roads with no pavements or signposts when they first moved in.

Working in Netheravon village shop, Linda was a friendly face to everyone – many of you will have known her, if not by name, a familiar face. She always had a twinkle in her eye and a quick reply to a rude joke! She had a steely core and knew her path in life. She and Keith lived a simple life, content with just the two of them and their weekly outings locally and holidays in Devon. She happily shared a bottle of wine (or two!) when we lived next door and never said a bad word about anyone. They were regulars in The Swan and championed all things local.

Linda remained a friend until her untimely death and if you ever encountered her, you would have enjoyed her warmth and friendship.

A community is only ever as good as the sum of its people. Right to the end Hannah, Kathryn, Pete and many others worked together to ensure Linda had the care and comfort needed. Pete and I have left Enford but Linda's brought us back, perhaps that's the way Enford is, it reels you in and part of you never leaves. I could definitely think of worse places to grow up and live – Linda was a lucky lady. Happy memories Linda, you were one of a kind.

# Recipe of the Month



# Spanísh Físh Stew

350g small salad potatoes halved

450g / I lb chunky white fish cod or haddock in large cubes

175g chorizo sausage, skinned and roughly chopped

350g jar roast peppers in oil, drain & chop, oil reserved

1 garlic clove crushed2 small red onions, cut in thick wedges175ml/ 6ozs dry white wine300g/ 11oz passata25g pitted black olivesSalt and ground black pepperPrawns optionalFreshly chopped flat leafed parsley

Preheat oven to 170C. Put potatoes, chorizo, roasted peppers, garlic, onions, wine and passata into a large casserole with 2 tbs of oil from the peppers. Season with salt & pepper.

Boil over a medium heat, cover with a tight fitting lid, cook in the oven for 45 mins. Add olives and fish and put back in the oven for 15 mins, until the fish is opaque and completely cooked through.

Spoon into warmed bowls and serve garnished with chopped parsley.

#### A community first approach to tackling shoplifting

Last month the Office for National Statistics showed a worrying increase in shoplifting in Wiltshire over the past 12 months. However, I want to reassure the public that plans are in place to tackle the increase and improve our engagement with retailers.

What must come first though is greater trust and confidence from retailers so we can ensure that every crime instance is being reported and we have an accurate picture of retail and business crime in Wiltshire. Once we reach this point, it is likely that we will see a continuing increase in recorded shoplifting offences before the measures we are putting in place will start to drive them down.

I recently met with local retailers in Warminster and will continue to maintain dialogue to ensure the concerns of retailers are addressed and that partners are working together to effectively address shoplifting and its drivers.

It's important that shoplifting should not be dismissed as a victimless, lower level crime as we are seeing this increasing trend being used by organized crime groups to fuel criminality and the clear impact on retailers, employees and the wider community should not be understated.

I will continue to challenge Wiltshire Police to better tackle shoplifting and am pleased that a new business crime strategy has been developed which outlines a clear forward plan. This will be supported by the increased focus on police visibility and neighbourhood policing under the direction of Chief Constable Catherine Roper - we must ensure that people are able to feel safe in the communities where they live and work.


