Thoughts from Rev. Philip Bromiley All Change

They say change is inevitable, except from vending machines. October is a month of season change. Rev Gale Hunt is retiring after having served as Team Vicar in the Avon River Team for 12 years. During this time, Gale has been a dedicated, loyal presence in our churches and greatly valued member of the Staff Team. Gale guided us through a lengthy Interregnum (before I was appointed as Team Rector), the small matter of a Covid pandemic, and the subsequent financial crisis. Gale has served the wider area as Rural Dean, after a stint as Assistant Rural Dean, making a significant contribution as school governor for both Netheravon and Bulford. To justify a new Team Vicar being appointed for our churches, we must be in good heart, have secure finances as well as growing congregations. So I am appealing to us all throughout the Villages and wider community. Please support the local church any way you can in the months ahead: come to the odd service (we have a huge variety), offer to help out either practically or by regular donation, and pray for your church too as we enter this time of transition.


Enford Film Club Tuesday 22nd October

Recipe of the Month

CRUNCHY CHICKEN AND LEEK CRUMBLE

Serves 4-6

1 large organic/free range cooked chicken remove all the flesh and chop into 1" chunks

For the Sauce: For the Topping:

50g butter 50g wholemeal or ciabatta bread

250g leeks, cut 25g melted butter

50g plain flour 25g grated cheddar/parmesan

425-500ml chicken stock 25g flaked almonds/walnuts cut

2-3 tbsps dbl cream 1 tbsp chopped parsley

squeeze of lemon salt and pepper

Chopped Tarragon

salt and pepper

Melt the butter in the pan, add the leeks and cook for 3-4 mins till beginning to soften. Stir in the flour, cook for a minute then add the stock. Bring to the boil, stirring all the time. Simmer for a minute or two, then add the cream/creme fraiche and season well. Sharpen with a little lemon juice stir in the tarragon and taste.

Stir the chicken chunks into the sauce and turn into an ovenproof dish. Combine the ingredients for the topping and sprinkle over the chicken. Cover and chill until required or freeze.

Cook at 200 degrees C. Gas 6 for 20 minutes, cover with foil and cook for a further 15-20 minutes, until golden and bubbling.

Serve with new potatoes/mash and green vegetables or a salad.

ENFORD PARISH COUNCIL

Abridged Draft Minutes of the meeting of 3rd September 2024

24/073 Public Question Time Mr Jim Hayward and friend attended the meeting with concerns regarding the Police/WCouncil response during the last two Road Traffic Accidents (RTAs) resulting in the A345 road closures. In both instances he complained that the Police were slow to attend and did not know the area and roads well enough to redirect the traffic in a sensible manner. Traffic directed onto the C32 caused a complete standstill for hours with two further Police cars and an Ambulance unable to move. He felt traffic should have been directed from B crossing to Everleigh rather than through Coombe, Enford and East Chisenbury. Due to the A345 closure overnight, some residents were still unable to leave their houses the next day as the traffic build up was at a standstill. He felt the Police should be informed of the local concerns as well as Wiltshire Council.

Subsequently WC Ian Blair-Pilling asked for time to consult neighbouring parishes who suffer from the same problems. A joint letter from all parishes involved would carry more weight with both Wiltshire Council (Highways) and the Police.

24/076 Unitary Council Matters WC Blair-Pilling raised the following points:

- 1. Flooding meeting. Cllrs Roberts and Farrow with Mark Symonds have been involved with WC's Danny Everett on the matter of the drains in Enford both sewerage and water. They have prepared a map of all the drains in the village with photo evidence and a written report which will go to Trowbridge when complete. This will constitute a working map from which WC will attempt to assist in solving some of the drainage issues which cause the Winter/Spring flooding problems. WC Blair-Pilling said there would be no 'instant fix' and asked that people continue to report any blocked drains and gulleys on the MyWilts app. In relation to this matter, Cllr Hiskett asked for WC Blair-Pilling's assistance in getting a response from the Public Rights of Way contact regarding the flooding/mire in Fifield where the footpath meets the road. Earlier this year the whole area had been under inches of mud and standing water in summer the problem has disappeared.
- **2. Extra money into Roads.** Due to extra money being available, WC are now dealing with issues on C roads. Please keep reporting issues with roads on the My Wilts app or to the PC's Roads and Highways representative, Cllr Martin Farrow.
- **3.** <u>Meeting in Durrington.</u> He reported on meetings that had been held (and more to be held) with himself and Graham Wright along with the MoD regarding the presence of some 400 Afghanis and their families currently based at Larkhill. (There are also more families at Tidworth, Bulford and Perham Down as well as other parts of the country). They are awaiting the Army's full vetting before being housed but their presence has caused some disquiet with locals due to their long stay. A process which should have taken 6 weeks is now in its 6th month. They are all entitled to be in the country indefinitely and have the same rights (work and

benefits etc) as any other local residents however they do not at present have jobs or anywhere to go. Groups of them getting together have caused some attention. The apparent 'influx' has not before been publicised to local residents and these meetings are to explain the situation everyone is in and how it is hoped to solve it. Integration is happening and naturally school places need to be found for them so WC is also involved though this is in fact the MoD's responsibility, not Wiltshire Council's. Anyone wishing to welcome the Afghanis and offer to volunteer their time and assistance is also very welcome to attend.

4. <u>Bulford Military Pool.</u> A Swimming Club used to operate here but it closed down. Ian was pleased to announce that swimming lessons will be starting again. This is still a military pool as opposed to a WC pool and there are benefits in joining which can be applied to Council's pools. WC offer free swimming to children to encourage involvement and health benefits.

24/079 Matters Arising The Allotment Site. The PC asked KC Outdoors Services (ground maintenance contractor) to assist with a clearance of the Allotment site in Water Lane. The current tenant has cultivated some of the area and following both the PC's and DEFRA's Rules and Regulations is hoping to keep chickens as well. The ongoing maintenance of the overall site will be reviewed on a regular basis.

The Memorial Garden path. Cllr Hiskett has spoken with Dan Withers (Landscape Gardener) as to the best way to deal with the dilapidated path. The wooden edging is rotting and the path itself is full of weeds. Three options were discussed (i) Leave it as it is. (ii) Remove the rotten edging, lift off approximately two inches of the surface, fill with topsoil and sow with grass. (iii) As above but fill with gravel. Depending on the number of volunteers this could take two days, involve the cost of a digger, trailer and either grass seed or gravel costing circa £5,000. After some discussion it was decided that Cllr Waight would spray the path with weedkiller and a volunteer work party would be arranged to remove the rotten edging boards. Cllr Hibberd thought putting It back to grass was the simplest long term answer and asked about the PC's insurance situation – safest option for the public.

A345 Safety issues/Cllr Farrow/LHFIG committee. Following the representation of residents on the A345 at the July meeting (24/055), Cllr Farrow has spoken to the Parish Steward re cutting back vegetation. This is not a job he is able to do due to safety issues involved. He has now put forward the complete list of issues as a whole (speeding and limits, lack of armco barriers or fencing, overgrown vegetation etc) to the Highways team/committee (LHFIG) for their assessment and assistance where possible. This will hopefully be discussed at their next meeting. As previously reported, they will not be able to cover every aspect of the concerns but would hopefully assist in creating a safer driving environment for the immediate residents.

<u>Streetlight in Water Lane.</u> As in previous years the streetlight in Water Lane has not been effective due to overgrown vegetation. The two immediate property owners have taken back all the overgrowth and plan to keep it this way. It is greatly improved and the PC would like to thank them for their 'robust approach'.

24/080 Resident's issues Raised. Cllr Clark raised the matter of of asbestos pieces and dust blowing directly on to the adjacent public footpath on the Plain. From the barn burned down last June. Landmarc have placed a sign to warn people not to enter or pass but have not addressed that asbestos sheeting is still breaking in the wind and spreading asbestos dust. The Clerk will contact Landmarc again.

24/084 Parish Hall Clir Cliffe-Roberts was unable to attend but Clir Roberts explained briefly that the PHMC AGM had taken place – the draft minutes will be available shortly. The online application to dissolve the charity can now take place and at the end of this process, the Coronation Garden and Parking will revert to the Parish Council for management and maintenance.

<u>24/088</u> Any Other Business i. Cllr Farrow reported that the defibrillator at the Red Lion in East Chisenbury had been taken out but not used. The system has been checked and is back in 'ready to use' condition.

ii. As the next meeting is not until November, Cllr Roberts raised the matter of Remembrance Sunday. He and Cllrs Hiskett, Cliffe-Roberts and Farrow will organise a working party to put up the poppies. Though effective and much liked the Tommy silhouettes were mentioned as an additional focus however they are very expensive and it was agreed not to proceed. Cllrs will be asked if they would lay a wreath and this will be decided nearer the time.

This is why I'm looking for your opinions on the Police and Crime Plan, as it will set the framework and strategic direction for Wiltshire Police.

Whilst improvements have been made in regards to policing in Wiltshire since I drew up my first Police and Crime Plan in 2021, I must stress that there is more work to do in key areas within the force, the Chief Constable is aware of my expectations and shares my belief that the updated Police and Crime Plan needs to reflect our joint commitment to making Wiltshire a safer place to live and work.

By giving me your thoughts and opinions on my updated Police and Crime Plan, you will help me to create a document by which the performance of Wiltshire Police and my office can be judged.

210 Figheldean - Devizes (Thurs only)
