

#### Ice cream Christmas Pudding

A very easy, refreshing alternative to traditional Christmas pudding.

#### Ingredients

150gms mixed dried fruit

1/2 cup brandy

1/2 tsp mixed spice

1 ltr quality vanilla ice cream

1 orange juice & zest





Soak dried fruit and orange in the brandy for at least an hour and preferably overnight.

Remove ice cream from the freezer and allow to slightly soften.

Add mixed spice to the fruit mixture and then stir in the ice cream.

Cover and re-freeze.

Serve as a traditional pudding or in individual bowls as preferred.



The Great Bustards are now in the winter flocks, or "droves". The males form their own droves, and the other droves consist of the females and their young of the year. The juveniles stay with their mother until middle of January, when the young males move over to the male droves.

Great Bustards do not form pairs, and the female does all the incubation and chick rearing.




# Recipe of the Month TIAN OF CRAB (Serves 2)

With Christmas coming we have given a recipe for a delicious canapé, which can also be served as a starter. The recipe is easy which we need. It can be prepared in advance or put together on the day. If serving as canapés, definitely put them onto toasts/ crostini just before serving. The recipe is for 2 starters or 12 canapes but can be increased for the number of guests you have.

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

1/2 avocado, peeled & diced Lemon Juice 150g white crab meat Mayonnaise Cayenne pepper 1/2 pink grapefruit, segmented Mixed salad leaves



#### **METHOD:**

Mix avocado with little lemon juice and salt and place in the bottom of 2 metal rings to form an even layer (or use two plates)

Mix the crab meat with a little mayo to bind & season with lemon juice salt and cayenne to taste. Place this mix on top of the avocado so that it almost fills the ring moulds Top with a couple of grapefruit segments then garnish with a few salad leaves and a drizzle of olive oil.

The recipe above is for a starter but can easily be used for about 24 canapés if you put the avocado, then crab, topped with a piece of grapefruit onto a small piece of toast or crostini. Ignore the salad leaves.



#### A Voyage of Discovery: The Paintings of George Raper.

George Raper was a young midshipman on H.M.S. Sirius, part of the First Fleet to Australia 1788—1792. A lucky discovery of a group of unsigned watercolours of exotic birds and flowers, became one of the greatest finds of previously unknown flora and fauna of the Sydney area. This talk explores Raper's four year long voyage, overcoming disease, starvation and shipwreck and his return, with his exquisite watercolours intact.

Our speaker, Clive Stewart-Lockhart began his career with Sothebys and held senior management positions with 2 leading UK auction houses. He was a familiar face on Antiques Roadshow and chair of the Society of Fine Arts Auctioneers, speaking on fine arts topics in UK and abroad.

#### Police and Crime Commissioner Philip Wilkinson's Column

As part of a new campaign we've launched, I'm urging young people, their families and friends to be educated on spotting the signs of child criminal exploitation, including going missing, unexplained gifts, being secretive, glued to their phone, and becoming friends with older groups.

Tackling serious violence is a priority for myself and Chief Constable Catherine Roper recognizing the serious harm it causes victims, families and the community. Child criminal exploitation can be an unnoticed crime, which makes it dangerous with potentially devastating consequences. Criminals can prey on children, taking advantage of their innocence and putting them in dangerous situations.

The Wiltshire Serious Violence Duty Strategic Needs Assessment (SNA) – a multiagency initiative aims to better understand serious violence in Wiltshire and why it happens – highlights a 2023 schools survey which demonstrated that only 3% of young people admitted to having carried a knife.

However, young people estimated that around 19% of their peers carried a knife, demonstrating the significant difference between the perceived threat of youth knife carriers versus the reality; perpetuating a culture of fear among youngsters. The campaign will challenge these perceptions.

The police cannot tackle this issue alone, and my office will continue working with partners including young people to ensure this type of crime is recognised, reported and that those directly affected are protected.

#### Couple raise over £23,000 for Stars Appeal Benson Suite

A couple supported by the Stars Appeal Benson Suite after the loss of their baby son and daughter have raised over £23,000 in their memory. Neal and Els Riley lost their son Oscar at 31 weeks in January 2023. Their world fell apart again in November that year when they lost their daughter Sophie at 35 weeks.

The Benson Suite provides a dedicated, private space where families who experience the death of a baby at birth can be cared for with their baby, The specialist suite helps ensure the time these families are able to spend with their baby is made as precious, dignified and personal as possible.

Neal and Els with the support of friends and family have been raising money over the last 18 months. Since January 2023, £23,512 has been raised in memory of Oscar and Sophie.

Neal and Els said: "The Benson Suite provided a space where we could process the tragedy and come to terms with losing Oscar and Sophie. The staff were incredible, supporting us throughout and making us feel at ease."

#### **ENFORD PARISH COUNCIL**

#### Abridged Draft Minutes of the meeting of 5<sup>th</sup> November 2024

**24/091 Public Question Time** Whilst there were no members of the public present, Cllr Roberts wanted to note the PC's congratulations to the Enford Community Fund on organising a very successful and enjoyable Bonfire and Fireworks night. Initial reports show over 700 people attended from local villages as far as Salisbury, Amesbury, Durrington, Bulford, Market Lavington, Marlborough, Westbury and Swindon. They've received great comments on social media. Congratulations and thanks to Fund organisers and all who volunteered support on the night.

**24/092 Police Matters and Neighbourhood Watch** The Police Report was circulated to all Cllrs. Cllr Waight confirmed that the hare coursers were active again and he has had his fences cut four times. The Police are increasing patrols particularly around farms and engaging with farmers on crime prevention advice.

Cllr Clark reported on Neighbourhood Watch who are focussing on the <u>Railway Guardian</u> <u>app;</u> an all-in-one app from the Transport Police. You can report crimes/concerns on the rail network, share your journeys with trusted contacts and access news, guides and support.

Help keep drinking water free from lead solder - WaterSafe, the national register of approved plumbers, is advising residents to ask plumbers working on their drinking water supply "Are you using lead-free solder?" Lead build up in the body can cause health issues. Most plumbers use lead-free solder but a survey showed some still use lead solder. They also list ideas for securing your home this winter – closing curtains, upgrading your locks, installing motion activated lights around your home and securing your garden. Many people are reporting sheds and outbuildings being broken into particularly during the full moon as thieves do not need extra light sources (headlights, torches etc). She also raised a question from a resident, "Would the PC like some poppies from seeds taken from the Somme in 2013?". Cllr Roberts thought these would be nice, particularly in the Coronation Garden.

**24/094 Unitary Council Matters** WC Blair-Pilling wanted to raise the points: The recent Planning Application at the site of the old mink farm had been turned down. Yet again this was due to the entry and egress point on the A345. Highways has previously assessed this as dangerous as it is the without addition of traffic from a new development. Previously reported road safety issues on the A345. (See July Minutes, Public Questions 24/055). Cllr Farrow has put these concerns to the Local Highways and Footpath Investigation Group (LHFIG) for discussion and a possible solution.

**Afghani refugees.** He reported the recent Youth Event in Durrington was a great success and they are hoping to repeat it next year. It is a wide range of local groups showcasing their passion for sports, hobbies and interests. It has helped many refugee families find interesting and fun ways for their children to integrate better into the local community. WC is not introducing 'no car' areas as other Councils – one could not enforce a 'cycle to work' policy in somewhere as rural as Wiltshire.

Cllr Holdway had two questions for WCllr Ian Blair-Pilling. An enquiry into more lighting in Water Lane, a poorly lit area. She was directed to apply to LHFIG with this request. Also a resident in Paddock Close seems to have five cars and is taking spaces from his neighbours. This is on Aster land and so neither the PC nor WC can make decisions or rulings, it would have to be put to Aster for resolution.

24/097 Matters Arising Update on Flooding. Cllrs Roberts, Waight and Mark Symonds the Flood Warden have collected supplies from WC to help with flooding needs this winter. It is the home owner's responsibility to take all safety precautions against flooding themselves. In dire need, the PC can step in to help. There have already been flooding issues this year. Cllr Roberts and Mark Symonds have created a map of all the drains and gullies in the parish and have attended meetings with the Environment Agency, Wiltshire Council and Wessex Water, who are engaging with the problems and checking to find the main problems. Cllr Roberts wanted to thank Mark Symonds for all the work he has done to date.

<u>Christmas tree lighting Event.</u> As always this will be on the first Friday in December which this year is 6<sup>th</sup>. The event will start at 6 o'clock and last for approximately half an hour. It has become a regular fixture and attracts more families and people each year – not to be missed! <u>Fifield mud and flood.</u> This issue has been going on throughout the year. Reports of the problems have been made to WC by residents, by the PC, the Parish Steward, by Wiltshire Bridleways Association and is being raised at the Wiltshire & Swindon Countryside Access Forum. As it is a 'merging point' of a Public Right of Way (PRoW) and a road, the delay and lack of response could be that the Highways and PRoWs depts each feel it is the others' responsibility. It is also one small area in the whole of the county and may not be a priority. The PC will continue to push for a resolution as when bad, it is a danger to pedestrians, animals and vehicles as well as an unsightly problem.

Parking Spaces in the Coronation Garden. As the Charity Scheme that previously ran the Parish Hall and Reading Room site is coming to a close, responsibility for 'The Coronation Garden' is reverting to the Parish Council. The parking spaces and garden area were created at the request of the Village Open meeting in 2018. Changes in the demographics of the village are inevitable, and currently two of the three parking spaces are available to let. Villagers in the immediate area of the site should approach the Clerk or Parish Council with any interest in licencing a space (on a 6-monthly or annual basis). Those spaces not required by licensees will be made temporarily unusable. A discussion was had on how to manage this and ClIr Cliffe-Roberts will look at costs of planters, reporting to the next meeting. The 'Private Parking' signs which were broken off and removed (prank or vandalism) — will be replaced with stencilled lettering. ClIrs. Hiskett and Cliffe-Roberts agreed to take care of this.

**24/098** Resident's issues Raised. A Coombe Lane resident had contacted the Clerk regarding army vehicles and rave attendees using Coombe Lane to get onto the Plain. He suggested a gate be placed at the end of the lane to stop this. It would also mean the local farmer would have to unlock said gate every time he needed to pass through the area. Unfortunately, the PC are unable to assist as this is MoD land and the PC has no jurisdiction.

A resident of West Chisenbury had written to the PC regarding (a) signage and (b) safety / speeding matters at the exit/egress point on the A345. There is a complete lack of signage for West Chisenbury and deliveries have ended up in East Chisenbury (which is signposted from Enford) and not then delivered. Secondly, the speed at which traffic goes through West Chisenbury (often more than 50mph). The exit/entry point is on an almost blind corner and is dangerous. There are no warnings of a hidden entrance, or even a mirror to see if traffic is approaching. Cllr Farrow has been asked to raise the matter with LHFIG.
