

Thoughts from Rev. Philip Bromiley Team A Month of Love.

Someone once said, "we should be thankful for our tears: they prepare us for a clearer vision of God." It's amazing to see great good come out of personal pain. In the looking back at the more difficult periods of our life, it's then that, more often than not, we also see love being expressed by those around us, hope being restored and subsequently sense God at work. Is God calling us to be the ones who come alongside others and show them His love?

The month of February is centred around love and loving relationships. On the 14th of the month, that most Romantic of days shall be upon on us. The feast of St. Valentine, a Roman martyr. Have you heard the joke about two acrobats who fell head over heels in love? I won't go there.

In tradition, the emperor Claudius took a liking to "Valentinus" but when he tried to convince Claudius to embrace Christianity, Claudius refused and condemned Valentinus to death, commanding that Valentinus either renounce his faith or he would be beaten with clubs and beheaded. Valentinus refused and was executed outside the Flaminian Gate in Rome on February 14, 269. It is said that he wrote a letter before his execution to a lady friend, saying "from your Valentine", hence the tradition. 

Great Bustards' centre opening

In December the GBG opened its new Visitor Centre at the Village Hall. The opening was held on the same day as the Great Bustard Group Christmas Fair. Dr Phil Harding DL, a bustard enthusiast, cut the ribbon and

Danny Kruger, our local MP, also attended. He is the Great Bustard Parliamentary Species Champion and was able to announce to the small crowd that Natural England had just declared the Great Bustard



as a priority species for England - a huge boost for our county bird.

The wet and windy weather kept a few folk away, but plenty of braver souls made it to the event. Everyone who went out to look for the Great Bustards saw them and a brisk trade was seen at the various stands and stalls that filled the main hall. This was the first Christmas Fair the GBG has held, but we anticipate it being a regular feature in the future.



The Bustards themselves are doing fine. The wet and windy weather can cause them to keep a low profile, but does not really bother them.

The males are already starting to moult and get their breeding plumage and some really impressive moustaches are already visible on some of the older males.

Recipe of the Month

FRENCH ONION SOUP

Serves 4, cook 2 hours 15mins



As I type this, the frost is heavy on the ground and although the simmering time is long, the making is very easy and it provides a delicious, warming bowl of soup for lunch or supper.

50g butter 4 slices crusty bread/baguette

tbsp sunflower oil 1 tbsp plain flour

500g onions, thinly sliced 1 1/4 L beef, chicken or veg stock

1/2 tsp caster or brown sugar2 garlic clove3 Small glass dry white wine/cider4 Salt and pepper

150 g Gruyere, Emmental or full flavoured hard cheese, grated

A glug of brandy (optional, of course).

Melt the butter and 1 tbsp oil in a large pan. Add the onion, sugar and a good pinch of salt. Cook on a low heat, stirring often for 45 mins to 1 hour, until the onion is very soft, sweet and golden brown. Pour the stock into another pan and bring to the boil. Add the flour to the onions and cook, stirring for another 2-3 mins. Add the hot stock and wine, season with salt and pepper and bring back to the boil. Reduce the heat and simmer for 45-60 mins, stirring occasionally to prevent catching. Toast the bread, rub with the garlic clove on both sides while still warm. Cover each piece with cheese. Preheat the grill. Add the brandy to the soup, if using, and check the seasoning. Ladle into ovenproof soup bowls and top each one with a piece of toast. Place under the grill until the cheese is bubbling. If you're not sure your bowls will take the heat of the grill, grill the cheese toasts on a baking tray and serve on top of the soup bowls.

Police and Crime Commissioner Philip Wilkinson's Column


I have recently launched a refreshed strategic policing approach for the county as my new Police and Crime Plan for 2025-2029 has been published after an extensive public consultation period.

The plan is a blueprint for Making Wiltshire Safer and continues to build on the successes of my first police and crime plan, which will run until April 2025. It will set out how Wiltshire Police and the OPCC's commissioned services for victims will continue to contribute to Making Wiltshire Safer, with investment, where needed, to improve 999 and 101 response times, increased visibility in all communities, especially rural ones, and a comprehensive package to tackle serious violence and reducing knife crime, alongside enhancing satisfaction among victims of crime. The force has been making serious strides in progression since it was placed into Engage early in my tenure the hard work paid off when this was lifted this year. There is always work to be done to improve effective and efficient Wiltshire Police can be, communities are telling me they see improvements in frontline policing, better visibility in communities in better outcomes for victims.

The Plan cannot succeed without everyone's involvement —police, community groups, and residents. Together, we can build stronger, safer neighbourhoods where people feel confident, safe and protected.

ENFORD PARISH COUNCIL

Abridged Draft Minutes of the meeting of 7th January 2025

The Police Report was circulated to all Cllrs. Reported incidents for Enford: two attempted break-ins in Coombe Lane – one a garden shed and another a vehicle parked on a drive. It was later reported the vehicle was burgled and hundreds of pounds of tools and materials stolen. The Police have increased their patrols in the area and continue to engage with farms on the matter of hare coursing. The Police were also available to talk in the Church car park last Friday, 3rd January. Cllr Clark reported on the seasonal warnings from Neighbourhood Watch. These include home security and awareness of child abuse.

25/005 Unitary Council Matters WC Blair-Pilling wanted to raise the following points: Update on flooding. Ground water levels in Wiltshire remain high and therefore any substantial rain will have an impact.

The County's Budget. is still being sorted before going to the County Cabinet and eventual approval by the Govt. The latter is cutting rural resources by £1 million including public health, housing and National Insurance. Fortunately the County has raised extra funds from its assets and he said not to expect savings in services.

Devolution. WC Ian Blair-Pilling reported that the Government wants devolution across the country. The proposal as it stands would mean that Wiltshire, Somerset and Dorset – all mostly rural counties - to come together as a Unitary Council with a Mayor overseeing all administration and services – Policing, Public Health, housing etc. A Unitary Council is defined as overseeing a minimum of 500,000 residents. He gave an overview of the prospect which would reduce duplicated expenditure. Councils as they stand are being asked to consider and propose what they believe would be most beneficial to residents. This would assist with funding and grants to allow a smooth continuance of governance. Those existing Councils who do not engage in the proposals would lose Govt grants and would likely be forced to engage in the long term, suffering a large reduction in running costs and funding in the meantime. As it stands WC feels acceptance and forward planning is the best route forward. Bournemouth and Christchurch may be included and though it already has a Mayor, Swindon may join 'the unit'. The Swindon Mayor currently deals with 250,000 residents and is currently not eager to be included. Due to the Consultation periods required for such large changes, this could affect the Local Elections currently expected in May.

25/008 Matters Arising Christmas tree lighting Event – Friday, 6th December went well despite being moved into the Church that afternoon due to forecast bad weather. About 50 villagers, adults and children, attended. Thanks were expressed for a lovely evening and the Chairman wished to thank Fi Leakey, Morag Hiskett and Marjut Roberts for the snacks and homemade mince pies, Clive Bullen for the sound system, Peter and Beren Cliffe-Roberts for preparing the mulled wine, Bruce Waight for help with the tree and Mort Burdick for presenting fun and carols. Due to the bad weather and high winds over Christmas, batteries needed replacing, lights had gone out and baubles had been blown off the tree. The tree was taken down by ClIrs Hiskett and Roberts on 6th January. It was agreed that next year more resilient lights should be bought.

<u>Update Flooding</u>. The Flood Warden, Mark Symonds and Cllr Roberts attended a Flooding meeting on 18th December. Wessex Water has inspected the Pumping Station behind the Parish Hall site and agreed that it needs updating, it is hoped this will happen in the very soon. It will help in keeping the drains and gullies clearer.

<u>Annual Litter Pick.</u> The date for the annual Litter Pick has been set for Saturday, March 22nd from roughly 10 am to 11.30. Cllr Roberts will speak with The Swan regarding the customary refreshments to wind up the morning.

25/009 Resident's issues Raised. Cars blocking the Public Right of Way by The Red Lion. A resident of East Chisenbury contacted the Clerk regarding the quantity of cars blocking the public right of way leading from the Red Lion onto the Plain. Whilst this piece of land is owned by the Red Lion they also have to allow for the public to cross it. This is a Bridleway and by law, access has to be available to walkers, bikes, horses, powered wheelchairs and mobility scooters. It is currently used by the staff so as not to take up space in the car park which is for customers. Cllr Farrow has offered to speak to the Manager to ask the staff for greater consideration not only for the law but also for people using the Bridleway.

25/010 Finance The Clerk reported that there had been a spend of £761.83 in December giving a balance at the end of the month of £17,644.84. There were no questions from Cllrs.

25/013 Parish Hall_Cllr Cliffe-Roberts reported that the Charity Commission have finally terminated the Charity Scheme and that responsibility for the site now reverts fully to the Parish Council who were listed as the Custodian Trustees.

25/014 Roads and Highways Cllr Farrow reported that following concerns raised last month (and in November), Wiltshire Highways Department will be inspecting the length of the A345 which runs from B crossing right through into Enford. It is hoped this will result in speed reduction throughout, making it safer for residents.

All reported potholes have been dealt with.

Flooding in front of a cottage in East Chisenbury has returned. This is likely to be due to mud and silt run-off from the Plain blocking the drains.

25/015 Public Rights of Way (PROWs) Cllr Hiskett had nothing to report. Due to the recent freezing weather, the salt/grit bins should be checked. He and Cllr Roberts will do this. Cllr D'Arcy-Irvine requested salt for the Village Hall steps and entrance, this will be supplied.

<u>25/017</u> Any Other Business Cllr Roberts reported that this year there is the 80th Anniversary of VE Day (Victory in Europe) to be held on 8th May. He requested that this is on the March agenda for discussion.

25/018 Date of Next Meeting

- 3. Awards will be made to causes that benefit the community and not specific individuals.
- 4. No awards will exceed £1,000 in total.
- 5. For any award to be made, there must be agreement by at least 75% of the group.


