Save the date for the Summer Fete!

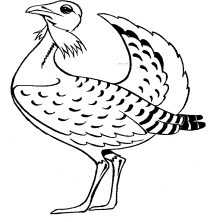
We're counting down to the Fete returning on **Saturday 21 June**, but we need your help to make it a success! Can you help?

Bustard News

The days are getting longer, and blue sky is no longer the stranger it was. The Great Bustards are now in their breeding plumage – orange breast feathers, huge moustaches and bright white tails. The males will begin competing against each other from the end of February, and then to attract females later in the spring.

Great Bustards do not form pairs but are a lekking species. A lek is a gathering of competing males which the females observe and select a male to mate. A dominant male will mate with a number of females. The Enford area holds the largest lek, and Bustards from the other sub populations across Wiltshire will visit this lek. These birds will fly in from Stonehenge area, The Wyllye Valley and from across the Plain.



The display of the male Great Bustard is one of the most spectacular sights in the bird world. The males inflate a large pouch in the front of their neck, fold their heads back, raise their tails over their heads and twist their wings so the wingtips cross behind their head. When in full display they are visible for miles by the unaided human eye. They do not look like birds, but large white flashes in the distance. Visitors have mistaken them for MoD signs, white fertilizer sacks or unusually bright sheep!

Recipe of the Month:

Bang Bang Chicken

- | | |
|---------------------------------------|-------------------|
| 8 chicken thighs (bone in skin on) | 2 tbsp soy sauce |
| 1 clove of garlic (finely chopped) | 1 tsp sesame oil |
| 1 thumb sized piece of ginger, | 2 tbsps olive oil |
| 1 tbsp <u>crunchy</u> peanut butter | 1 tsp brown sugar |
| 1 tsp chilli flakes (more if wanted!) | |

Preheat the oven to 200C/Gas mark 6/top oven of AGA.

Trim the skin on the thighs. Lay in a baking parchment lined roasting tin skin side down. Pour over the soy sauce, add the ginger and garlic and 1 tbsp olive oil. Massage into each thigh. Coat both sides of the chicken and put into the oven for 15 minutes.

Mix the peanut butter with the chilli, sugar, sesame oil and remaining tbsp olive oil. It will be thick so thin with some hot water.

Take the chicken out, turn them over and pour some of the juices into the peanut butter mix. Return it to the chicken pan, making sure the thighs are now skin side up. Return to the oven for a further 20 mins (if the thighs are particularly big, a further 5-10 mins).

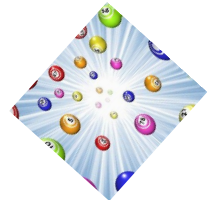
You want the skin to be deeply browned and crisp. Serve with rice or noodles and pak choi or a similar veg. **Quick, easy and comforting!**

Annual parochial church meeting


Friday April 11th at 5.30 pm in Enford Church

Applications for awards must be made in writing by email to **Enford-Fund@gmail.com** or by letter to one of the group members Carolyn Ansell, Katie Briscoe, Paul & Tracey Buttery, Rob Hibberd, Richard Petitt, Chris Rose).

The following guidelines will be followed in allocating funds:

1. Submissions will be considered at the next scheduled meeting and within 3 months of the request being submitted.
2. Funding will be made for individual projects and is not designed to allow awardees to become reliant on the award on an annual/regular basis.
3. Awards will be made to causes that benefit the community and not specific individuals.
4. No awards will exceed £1,000 in total.
5. For any award to be made, there must be agreement by 75% of the group.

Police and Crime Commissioner Philip Wilkinson

The transformation of Wiltshire Police's service will continue after my budget was approved by the police and crime panel. This support will mean that the police precept will rise by £14 a year, for a Band D property. It isn't a position I wanted to be in but I was faced with having to make £11 m of savings if I didn't. Even with the rise, £6.8m of savings need to be delivered by transformation of police services. I can reassure you Wiltshire Police will always have protecting the public, increasing public access and making Wiltshire Safer at fore front of every decision we make.

I am asking the Chief Constable to do more with less funding. I am asking her to improve the policing service, for more visible and effective policing but with less funding than the majority of Chief Constables.

Wiltshire Police is delivering – we have the most police officers we have had in a decade, increased outcome rates, crime is decreasing in some crime types year-on-year, and communities are seeing more visible policing with improving 999 and 101 response times. This comes at a cost so I had to ask for the maximum increase.

We know there is more to do to make people feel safe and we will ensure that Wiltshire Police continue on that improvement journey and will lead the way as one of the most effective and efficient forces.
