Enford's Second World War -Resilience, Resistance and Service

Jon Cresswell: Royal Artillery Historical Society

The 80th anniversary of Victory in Europe (VE) Day is very rightly commemorated as a celebration in the United Kingdom. The war years represented a trial and a trauma for Britain and her people and the cost paid was heavy both in human life and in treasure. The country sacrificed its economic future to act as the final bulwark to fascism in Europe. From June 1940 until the same month a year later, she stood alone, an island fortress protected by the dark grey steel of her Navy and the loyalty of her empire which rushed troops across the oceans to the defence of the mother country. VE Day should not be viewed as an act of remembrance, there is a time and place for that, and that is Remembrance Day. VE Day is a party to mark the victory of the democratic free world over tyranny, the end of wartime restrictions, the cessation of fighting and hopefully the dawn of a new world. While 8th May might have been the latter, the new world was to include a new confrontation, with Europe separated by an iron curtain and a new ideological adversary. Rationing continued as the slow rebuild of a country ravaged by aerial bombardment began. The country that emerged from the Second World War was a very different one from the Great Britain that declared war of Nazi Germany in 1939. It is a legacy to be proud of, but it came at significant price.

Our collective memory of the Second World War is through a number of waypoints which invariably must start with the trauma of the Great War, where the Allies were victorious against Germany but again at a price. For Britain the price was far higher than in 1939-45, albeit civilian casualties were far higher this time as war now came into the homes and factories of the British people in the form of bombs and rockets. France and Britain declared war on Nazi Germany on 3rd September 1939 in defence of Poland although there was little they could do to save their ally from both Germany and indeed Russia, which invaded Poland from the east. While the Royal Navy established sea control and blockaded Germany, the Royal Air Force also began its campaign against enemy shipping and carried out leaflet drops and reconnaissance sorties as well as defending against the first German raids against British shipping.

A Phoney war, or standoff, took place on the Franco-German border while an abortive attempt to secure Norway was defeated by a parallel German invasion. France fell in seven weeks and Britain stood alone and fought the Luftwaffe to a standstill before Hitler turned to terror and the night bombing of British cities. In turn, Bomber Command of the RAF attacked German cities and their war industry. Italy attacked Britain's lifeline to the Middle and Far East in Egypt and so the North African campaign began.

This was to last until 1943. Hitler's invasion of the Soviet Union and Japan's attack against the United States ensured that by the end of 1941, Britain was no longer fighting alone and the 1941 Lend-Lease agreement brought to bear the full might of America's economy and industry in support of Britain.

From North Africa, Montgomery's Eighth Army crossed the Mediterranean into Italy and with the Battle of the Atlantic won, Britain became an armed camp and the second front was opened in June 1944 with the Normandy Landings and so began the long fight into Germany from both East and West and Hitler's final defeat. Japan, having captured vast swathes of territory, is pushed back across Burma and from the Pacific Islands, finally surrendering after the dropping of two atomic bombs, a project which had its origins in Birmingham in 1940.

The males are still displaying but most of the females are now sitting on eggs. A handful of nests have been found in silage crops where the life of the female is at risk when the field is mown. Having found the nests by using a drone we take steps to ensure she is kept safe – sometimes this means removing her eggs (done under official licence).

She then leaves the danger area and will nest again elsewhere, and we will incubate the eggs and rear and release the chicks.



A female Great Bustard on her nest. This was photographed from over 200 feet. The crop around her is 50cm tall and the nest is impossible to see from ground level, and impossible to see from a tractor.

Recipe of the Month: Chicken and Leek & Rhubarb Dessert

A supper meal from the table of Michael Cole Fonteyn (with rhubarb kindly provided by Richard Farquhar).

Chicken and leek Casserole

4 large leeks 500gms Chicken breast/thighs Chicken stock 250gms Cream cheese

Soften pennies of leek in olive oil, season to taste and then gently add a rich chicken or vegetable stock and simmer. Gently whiten chunks of



chicken breast or brown chicken thighs in olive oil, add to the simmering leeks. Keep it all simmering for 30/40 minutes. Remove from heat and stir in cream cheese (Philadelphia is great). Stir on a low heat until it is completely dissolved.

Then serve with steamed rice or new potatoes.

Rhubarb Dessert

5 sticks of fresh rhubarb Sugar to taste I Orange



2 Star anise Cinnamon stick

Slice chunks of stem rhubarb, add minimal water and sugar to taste. Add two star anise and one cinnamon stick, the juice of one orange (or quarters of whole orange).

Gently simmer until the rhubarb barely holds its shape.

Remove spices and serve with ginger ice cream

"This is Enford Station All Aboard for Upavon Junction!"

This might have been the shouted cry of the Enford Railway Station Master - if only plans proposed between 1864 and 1897, to build a railway line running north from Amesbury (through Enford) to Marlborough and beyond, had ever come to pass!

In a period of 'Railway Mania' (1840s to about 1910), Salisbury Plain was pretty much encircled by train tracks laid down by aggressively competing regional railway companies. With Great Western Railway (GWR), London & South Western Railway Company, Manchester & Southampton Railway and Bristol & London & South Western Railway, it was a cut-throat environment with the big companies vying to attract more business and squeeze the smaller ones out!

One such smaller enterprise, the local North & South Wiltshire Junction Railway Company, was to build a line running from Amesbury Station (where Tesco's is today) up through Durrington, with additional stations at Netheravon, Enford (with a sidings depot at West Chisenbury) through to what was to be an important junction at Upavon. The Upavon Junction would have tracks leading northeast to Pewsey and Marlborough and northwest through Woodborough to Calne, Tetbury and Stroud - as well as a connection eastwards to Ludgershall and Andover!

Spoiler Alert! As it turned out, these plans were never commissioned! GWR convinced the Board of Trade in London that these 'upstart' lines would take away some of their business - and so in 1865 the North & South Wiltshire plan 'ran into the buffers' (as had the Upavon to Ludgershall line). So to this day Upavon remains a small, pleasant and unspoilt Wiltshire village, without any railway junction heritage which might once have rivalled Swindon! (Only joking!)

Although nothing was ever built, the proposed line would have pretty much followed the western side of our valley and would have stayed as close as between 20m to 100m west of the current line of the A345 road to Upavon.

Although this particular plan was just on paper - there is another, easily discoverable, 'dismantled railway' line from the early 1900s, parts of which can still be walked today. The Amesbury and Military Camp Light Railway line ran from about 350m north of the current Countess roundabout, in a north-westerly direction - and a footpath and the old embankments still wind their way through the Larkhill military estate. It was an important spur from Amesbury bringing up the thousands of troops, their horses, ammunition, equipment and rations to the 35 military camps sited along the south side of the firing ranges. Interesting evidence, that you can still see today, is that part of this line is known locally as The Apple Track - because of the randomly growing apple trees along the wayside. It is speculated that these sprouted from the apple cores, munched by the soldiers on the troop trains, then tossed out of the railway carriage windows!

Abridged Minutes of the meeting of 6th May 2025

25/034 Apologies No Apologies received but Cllr Roberts took the opportunity to read an official letter from Anthony D'Arcy-Irvine who decided not to stand for re-election. The Council would like to acknowledge his (circa) 12 years of serving on the Council and thank him for his contribution to the community as a whole.

25/036 Police Matters and Neighbourhood Watch The Police report had not been received, Cllr Farrow reported on the theft of two antique canons which had been taken from the back of a garden in East Chisenbury. Cllr Clark had nothing specific to report from Neighbourhood Watch

25/038 Unitary Council Matters WC Ian Blair-Pilling was congratulated on his re-election to Wilts Council in the recent elections. As the swing to the Lib Dems means there is no longer a majority party in charge of the Council, there will be a delay in the Cabinet positions being known until 20th May when the new Council meets for the first time. There are 98 seats within WC and the election result was Lib Dems 43, Conservatives 37, Reform 10 the others taken by Independents. Coalitions between the Cllrs are yet to be agreed, therefore unable to report on any Council business.

25/041 Matters Arising Approve the Accounts. The accounts for the financial year 2024-2025 have been 'internally' audited, again by Alan Day, and these were circulated to the PC for question or comment. All Cllrs were happy with the presentation and the accounts were officially signed off by the Chairman. They will now be sent for external audit. By law there is an official period of Notification of Inspection and these dates are prescribed as 3rd June to 14th July. Any member of the public may apply to the Clerk to see the accounts if they wish. (As a small, rural Parish, the Clerk is happy for anyone to request this at any time of the year).

The Coronation Garden. As was agreed by the Parish Hall Management Committee, the 3 parking spaces at the Coronation Garden were to be let on licence with the proceeds to contribute to the costs incurred in demolishing the old Hall, the development of the Coronation Garden and the ongoing cost of maintenance. The responsibility for the site has reverted to the Parish Council (following the closure of the Parish Hall charity), as Custodial Trustees of the site. The parking will to be available for those living in the immediate vicinity to occupy under licence, and any spaces not licenced will be restricted. The PC will now proceed with the restrictions.

The Litter Pick. Cllr Roberts reported this has been another successful year for rubbish!. He wanted to thank the residents who turned out on the day for their help and Hannah and the team at The Swan for supplying all the refreshments.

80th VE Day Celebrations. Cllr Roberts ran over preparations for the celebrations on Thursday, 8th May 8.30pm. Residents and Cllrs are all contributing to mark the day with the beacon being lit at the top of B Crossing The PC are supplying a free drink to attendees a pint of beer or a glass of fizz.

Drainage update. Cllr Roberts and Flood Warden, Mark Symonds, recently attended another meeting where they obtained a WC plan of the drains etc within Enford. It transpires these are not up to date but that will be remedied in the near future. One of the gullys that requires unblocking is within the grounds of Glebe House and the new owners are happy for this to proceed.

25/042 Resident's issues raised A resident had contacted the PC concerned about the cars and vans that ignore the cones in front of the Defibrillator in Enford. This was recently discussed and it was hoped the cones would suffice. The PC will investigate possible alternative locations for the Defibrillator and the Police and Ambulance services would then be notified of any relocation.

25/045 New Playpark Cllr Young had nothing new to raise apart from the fact that people are still allowing their dogs into the Playpark area (despite the signage).

N.B. The parasites and bacteria found in dog faeces can cause blindness, sickness and other distressing symptoms. This is why the area is fenced and gated – to keep dogs out of the area and to keep children safe when playing there.

25/046 Roads and Highways Cllr Farrow reported that the Parish Steward was cutting and clearing ditches he and WCllr Ian Blair-Pilling met in West Chisenbury with a resident concerned about safety, speed and signage. Visibility in a southerly direction when pulling onto the A345 is much reduced by a dip and bend in the road some 50 yards beforehand. Many vehicles are doing 60mph on that corner and are unaware of the access. Fencing hinders residents' visibility and he will raise this with LHFiG with the possibility of mirrors on the opposite side of the road to assist. A finger sign in Enford showing the direction of West Chisenbury was raised, it was thought that this would be unlikely to happen.

He updated the Council on the speeding and safety issues raised on entering Enford from the south. WC have proposed traffic slowing measures from New Town to Enford Hill and are in the process of re-surfacing. Painted road signs and cats eyes have yet to be achieved but it is hoped the measures will help to slow the traffic.

As requested by residents, 'courtesy bench' seating has now been installed in the bus stop on the northbound carriageway of the A345 at the top of Enford Hill.

<u>25/049</u> Any Other Business The Swan's sign over the road was raised, this is still missing. It is part of a Listed Building (The Swan) and therefore has to be replaced but it is not known when this will happen.

- -The Allotment site in Water Lane Is currently looking very scruffy as the natural vegetation is in 'full growth' mode. Whilst there's no criticism of the tended area, the stored wood/pallets do not add to the benefit of the site and the Council was asked if they were planning to do anything. This will be raised at the next meeting.
- It was noted that the hedge at the bottom of Water Lane is beginning to lean out into the Lane. Cllr Roberts said he would speak with the owner.
- Water Lane road markings. The dotted lines and 20mph signs need replacing into Grants Road and Paddock Close.



Wiltshire and Swindon

You may have read about the government's new "Neighbourhood Policing Guarantee" which they claim will put an extra 13,000 neighbourhood officers on our streets by the end of 2029. They say there

will be guaranteed dedicated neighbourhood police teams and extra police patrols in busy areas at peak times and a dedicated antisocial behaviour (ASB) lead in every force. To achieve these targets, we have been given an extra £1.6Million which in Wiltshire will be 24 police officers and 40 Special Constables by the end of 2026. While I applaud the initiative it has to be set against the overall financial deficit of £5.2 million due to Wiltshire being the third lowest funded force per head of population in the country.

We are fortunate in Wiltshire Police, that our Chief Constable has already put in place most of these new government neighbourhood police initiatives and to balance the books without reducing officer numbers, so these new officers are appreciated and will improve the service we provide.

While I have been lobbying this and the last government to revise the police funding formula, I want to thank the six Conservative and Liberal Democrat MPs in Wiltshire, who have written to the government to raise this issue again.

While our funding formula leaves us at a disadvantage to most other forces, I am delighted to report that the performance of Wiltshire Police continues to improve; the levels of most crimes are down and arrests are up. But as far as the Chief Constable Catherine Roper and I are concerned we want more improvements still.
