Thoughts from Rev. Phillip Bromiley

Living for the Moment

Are you a person who is preoccupied with the past, the present or the future?

It seems to me that growing older means inhabiting the past and being younger means inhabiting the future. The older we get, the more we tend to look back and revel in the old days, when we could leave the front door open and trust the milkman to take his money from the kitchen table. The younger we are, the more we wonder about what we will do in a few years time, after school, after a job, after university, after the gap year. Either way, we risk neglecting the present.

The phrase "this day" occurs 118 times in the Bible. God is all about the present. "From **this day** on I will bless you," God promises through Haggai (Ch . 2 v 19).

A couple in a retirement home were reminiscing about the past. The woman said to her husband, "can you remember when we first met and the smile we gave to each other?" He nodded and smiled.

"Can you remember how we would go for walks and you held my hand?" she said. He nodded and reached out to her and held her hand.

Happy Snapping!

Recipe of the Month: Flamiche.

With the weather still so cold and wet we have chosen a traditional recipe from northern France.

Ingredients:

1 pack all butter shortcrust pastry (or puff if preferred)

For the filling:

800g leeks trimmed and finely sliced

60g butter

6 tbsp double cream/crème fraiche

A little nutmeg grated

2/3 large eggs, beaten

1 tbsp tarragon chopped

60g grated Parmesan (optional)

Salt and pepper

Method

Preheat oven to 200C. Gently cook the leeks in the butter until soft. Transfer to a large bowl and allow to cool. Add the cream, nutmeg, tarragon (and Parmesan if using), then season well. While the leeks are cooking grease a flan case. Roll the pastry into a large circle and use to line the flan case. Prick the bottom all over with a fork. Blind bake for 15/20 minutes if preferred

Spread the leek mixture over the pastry base, then brush egg yolk over the exposed edges of the pastry. Bake for 30-40 minutes until the pastry is golden. A pre heated baking sheet under the pie will help crisp the base.

In some areas a layer of diced ham is put in the pastry case before the leek mixture is added, it also sometimes has a pastry lid as well.

GREAT BUSTARD GROUP

Moustaches drooping in the rain, male Great Bustards still look magnificent.

In the short spells between the ongoing rain, we have recorded some movement between the Great Bustard populations around South Wiltshire. When the sun appears groups of males leave their wintering haunts and head to their summer areas, and then promptly head back again when it starts raining again.

One of the headstarted chicks from last summer is now living on the Somerset levels. She is wearing a GPS with a transmitter, and we can watch her moving back and forth between the only two green fields in that area, the rest being underwater. We expect her to come back to Salisbury Plain in the summer, and she will then likely stay around south Wiltshire for the rest of her life. If she can avoid power lines and silage cutting, she will live for around 20 years.

The Arts Society - Pewsey Vale lecture at Bouverie Hall at 2.30pm on Tuesday 3rd March

Roger Butler will speak on **Canal History and Heritage**, with special reference to The Kennet and Avon canal

This lecture provides an introduction to the secret world of our 2000-mile inland waterway network looking at all aspects of their artistic, architectural and engineering vernacular. Features from sweeping aqueducts to tiny bollards; from colourful historic narrowboats to 'Roses and Castles' artwork; from grand World Heritage Sites to quirky listed buildings. A well-known architectural historian once described our canals as a 'poor man's art gallery'.

Did you know that only the National Trust and the Church of England have more listed buildings than our waterways?

Roger Butler is a landscape architect and an experienced writer, lecturer and photographer with a particular interest in the history, architecture and traditions of our canal network. He has worked on some of the UK canal's major restoration projects. He is a fellow of the Royal Geographical Society, a Licentiate of the Royal Photographic Society and a chartered member of the Landscape Institute.

Doors open at **2.00pm** for refreshments and conversation and the lecture begins at **2.30pm**. Visitors are very welcome - **£7** on the door, payable by card or cash.


Stars Appeal Bookshop and bucket collection raises over £71,000

Stars Appeal volunteers are celebrating after having raised over £71,000 in the charity's bookshop and through bucket collections at Salisbury District Hospital during 2025.



Applications for awards must be made in writing, by email, to EnfordFund@gmail.com or by letter to one of the group members (Carolyn Ansell, Katie Briscoe, Tracy Buttery, Rob Hibberd, Richard Petitt, Chris Rose).

The following guidelines will be followed in allocating funds:

1. Submissions will be considered at the next scheduled meeting and within 3 months of the request being submitted.
2. Funding will be made for individual projects and is not designed to allow awardees to become reliant on the award on an annual/regular basis.
3. Awards are made to causes benefitting the community, not specific individuals.
4. No awards will exceed £1,000 in total.
5. For any award to be made, there must be agreement by 75% of the group.

Philip Wilkinson OBE, Police and Crime Commissioner for Wiltshire and Swindon.

Following the Police and Crime Panel's approval of my proposed 2026/27 budget, Wiltshire Police will be able to protect officer numbers and maintain community visibility. This decision comes as police forces nationwide face significant financial pressures, and Wiltshire is no exception. The cross-party Panel, made up of councillors from across the county, scrutinises the work of the PCC.

Despite delivering £8 million in efficiencies this year and facing a real-terms reduction in government funding, Wiltshire Police must still find a further £4.6 million in savings next year as costs rise. To meet these pressures, the Panel approved a £15 per year increase for a Band D household—around £1.25 a month. This forms a crucial part of the overall police budget, together with Government funding, and directly helps protect the frontline services residents say matter most.

This was not an easy decision, but it was the only viable option to protect vital services supporting the continued progress Wiltshire Police is making for our communities. Wiltshire is one of the lowest funded forces in the country yet continues to improve visibility, outcomes and public confidence. If funded at the national average, Wiltshire would receive an additional £49.6 million for frontline services.

I have been clear that there are no simple savings left. Without this increase, we would face reductions to services people rely on every day. This budget safeguards neighbourhood policing, maintains visible patrols and supports investment in modern operational capability.

I am grateful to the 1,015 residents who took part in our consultation, with 56 per cent supporting the proposal. After detailed scrutiny, the Panel agreed the increase is a fair and responsible balance in a challenging financial climate, allowing Wiltshire Police to save, sustain and transform while remaining rooted in its communities.
